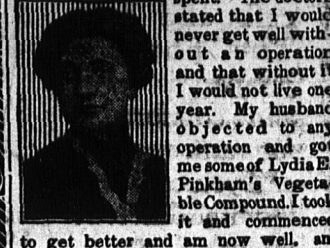

Provincial Legislature

(Continued from page one)

Mr. JOHNSTON wished to discuss the principles of the bill, but the PREMIER said he was not in order, as the principles of a bill could not be discussed on third reading.

Mr. JOHNSTON then consulted his chief and while they were talking the SPEAKER put the question to the House and declared it carried.

Mr. JOHNSTON protested and said he wished to move an amendment that the bill be read a third time that day two months.

The SPEAKER said he was out of order on the motion for the third reading had been carried.

Mr. BELL also protested and said that he had not heard the question put.

The PREMIER said that hon. members should pay more attention to the proceedings, which he believed that the rules of the House should be absolutely adhered to.

Mr. JOHNSTON then put his amendment and the Speaker immediately asked the Nays to stand.

Through some misunderstanding all the Opposition stood, and the Premier said as the Opposition negatived their own amendment it was defeated.

Mr. BELL maintained that as the Government had not voted, it meant that the amendment was carried.

Mr. ARSENAULT said according to the Nays if a member did not rise he was counted among the Nays, so that the amendment was unanimously negatived.

Mr. BELL regretted the Speaker had not made the matter more clear. A report of such proceedings going throughout the country made the members of the Opposition appear like a lot of school boys.

Mr. DALTON then moved that the bill be now passed.

Mr. JOHNSTON, seconded by Mr. Bell, moved as an amendment that the bill be recommitted to the Committee for consideration.

Mr. ARSENAULT said the amendment was out of order. The bill having passed its third reading could not be recommitted.

The SPEAKER put the question and declared the Nays had it.

Mr. Bell challenged a vote when it was carried by 16 to 13.

The HOUSE adjourned to 5 o'clock in order to allow the member to visit and inspect Falconwood.

SATURDAY, APRIL 29.

The House met at 11.20 a. m., Mr. Speaker Martin in the chair.

Mr. PATON rose to a question of privilege and drew attention to the allegation in the report of the Temperance Alliance that the Prohibition

Law had not been enforced. He said the statement was untrue. There had been less drinking in Charlottetown and Summerside during the last twelve months, than there ever had been before in his recollection.

Mr. BELL rose to a point of order and said the hon. member could not discuss that matter on a question of privilege.

On a question of privilege, Mr. J. J. Johnston drew attention to the headlines of a report in the Guardian stating that "Mr. J. J. Johnston falls from Grace," and that Mr. Bell concurred in what the Premier said regarding Mr. Johnston's unparliamentary conduct in making a personal attack upon the Premier.

Mr. JOHNSTON then made a few "complimentary" and "appreciative" remarks to the Editor of the Guardian, and said Mr. Bell did not concur in what the Premier had said.

Mr. BELL also on a motion of privilege endorsed Mr. Johnston's remarks, and said that he joined hands with the Premier in bringing order out of disorder. He did not charge Mr. Johnston but the Leader of the Government with being responsible.

Dr. The Hon. S. R. JENKINS in introduced a bill for the introduction of Medical inspection in the Public schools of the city of Charlottetown.

Mr. BELL reported that he had conferred with his colleagues with reference to the early rising of the House, and while they were not in favour of putting them on record, he did not think there would be, so far as he could see, any reason why the House should not rise on Wednesday or thereabouts.

The PREMIER said there was an accumulation of work and correspondance in his office which would take all his time on Monday, and he proposed to adjourn till Tuesday afternoon.

But if it would be understood that as far as possible they should arrange that the House would rise on Wednesday at 3 p. m.

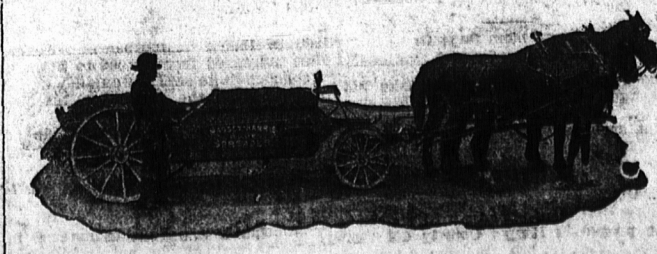
