

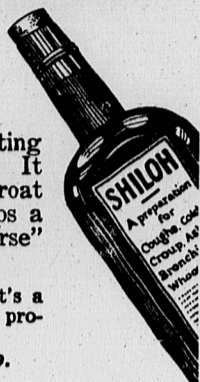

Mennonites Move To New Home

TORONTO, March 23.—Following the part of Mennonites from Russia which passed through Toronto a few weeks ago, the remainder of the big colonization group which wintered in Waterloo county started the last leg of their westward journey last night. A C. P. R. special train of ten cars pulled out from Kitchener and passed through Tor-

onto distribute its passengers in Manitoba and Saskatchewan. These Mennonites, though from Russia, are not Russians, but Holland Dutch people who have lived in Russia for many years. About 1,200 of them arrived in Canada late last summer and because their places were not ready for them many remained in Ontario with Canadian Mennonites, where they have gained valuable experience in farming methods, and most of the children have learned to speak English.

also played several selections during the evening. The accompanists were Mrs. Jas. McAleer, Borden and Mrs. Peter A. McMahon, Emerald.

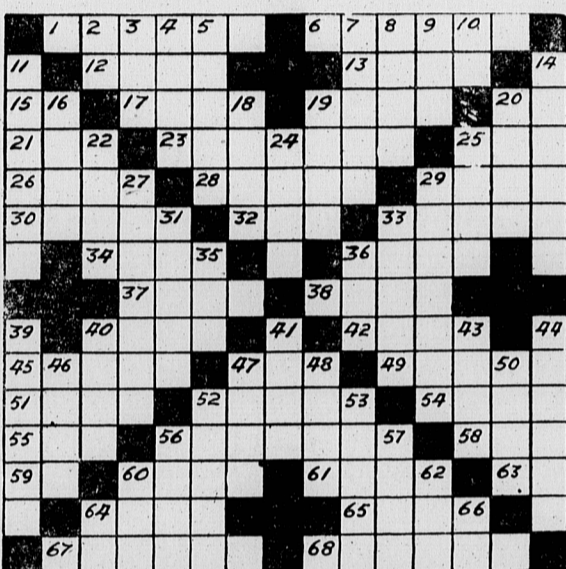

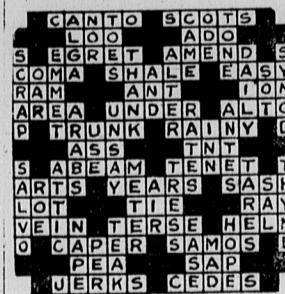

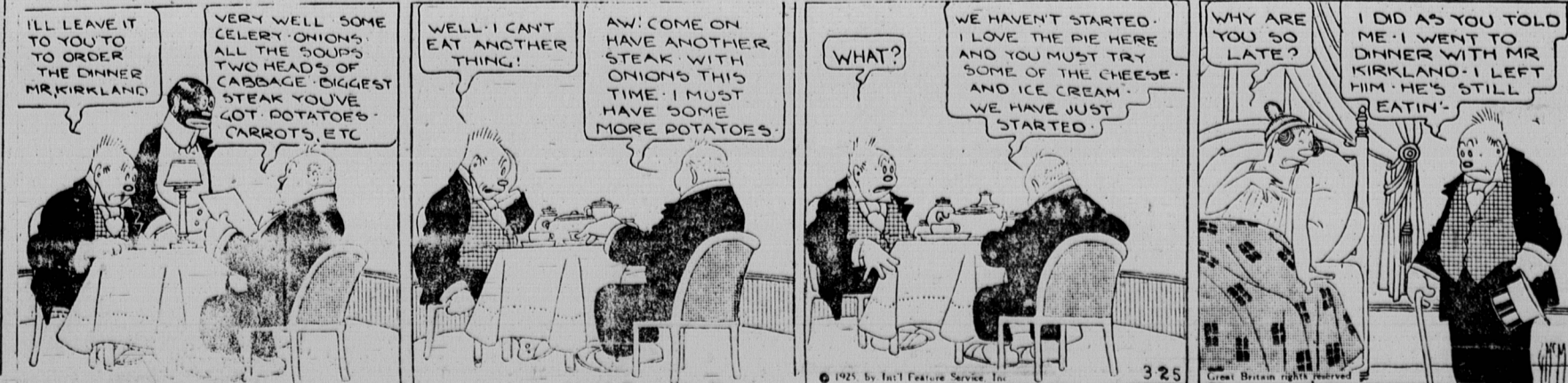
