## ROYAL COMMISSION OPENS INVESTIGATION

(From our own Correspondent.)  
 OTTAWA, April 25.—A surprise was sprung on the Royal Commission to investigate the Kite Fuse and Shell charges which opened here today when it was stated by Lieut.-Colonel David Carnegie, ordnance advisor to the Shell Commission, that on May 13th, of last year while at New York he had received a letter from the British Consul, Sir Courtenay Bennett, asking that no contracts for time fuses be signed until the representatives of the Shell Committee had consulted him, adding "this is very important in the interests of Canada." Just what this letter meant has not yet been shown.

Another rather striking feature of a day devoted to detail work was furnished by Mr. Carvell M. P., who took a leading part in making the charges against Sir Sam Hughes, and is acting as assistant counsel in support of them. Lieut.-Colonel Carnegie was describing his visit to New York, and showing that he had a very anxious time there with regard to these contracts. Carvell apparently did not like the manner in which the witness was giving his evidence, and jumped up to interrupt. He was at once sharply checked by Sir Ralph Meredith who said, "Mr. Carvell do not interrupt the witness. If you have any objection to make to his evidence you must address the Commission, not the witness." This ended the interruption, and from that time on Mr. Carvell did not attempt to interfere with the witness.

There was only one witness examined during the day, Lt.-Colonel David Carnegie, who was ordnance expert for the Shell Commission and whose name figured largely in the Parliamentary speeches of Messrs Kite, Carvell and Pugsley. Lt.-Col. Carnegie explained at great length his connection with the Shell Commission, his qualifications for his work as ordnance adviser, the methods of making shells and fuses, and his connection with the events that lead to the charges made in the House by Mr. Kite and Mr. Carvell. So far as Col. Allison was concerned Lt.-Col. Carnegie said that he had been directed to him by General Hughes as a man who would be likely to introduce him to other manufacturers of shells, and fuses, so as to introduce a new element into the contracting work, and thus reduce prices, which was what the Minister was interested in having regard to quality and speedy delivery. Lt.-Col. Carnegie recounted in detail his work at New York, his meeting Col. Allison, his introduction to Yukon and other manufacturers in the States, and described his negotiations with them with a view to getting fuses made. Since all efforts to have these time fuses made in Canada had failed, he said that efforts had been made to get Canadian manufacturers interested in making the fuses, which was a very delicate work, but these had been refused, as the Canadian manufacturers had declined to undertake it, owing to the expense of starting a plant and the uncertainty of orders to justify so heavy an outlay, which would run to about \$200,000.

Lt.-Colonel Carnegie was still on the stand when the Commission rose for the day, and his examination in Chief will continue tomorrow. While so far the work of the commission has gone to the hearing were Major-General Sir Sam Hughes, who was actively assisting his Counsel, and Col. J. Wesley Allison, who was evidently in ill health, and took no part in the proceedings. Mr. G. W. Kite, whose charges in Parliament started the enquiry was conspicuous by his absence.

## AIR RAID WAS SUCCESSFULLY REPULSED

(Special to the Guardian.)  
 BERLIN, April 26.—An official account of the British raid on the Coast of Flanders Monday was issued here today. It says the Admiralty reports that on the morning of April 24 numerous enemy forces appeared off the Coast of Flanders. They were composed of great and small steamers apparently searching for bombs and outlying buoys for bombardment. Three of our torpedo boats stationed off Flanders repeatedly attacked the monitors, destroyers and auxiliaries and pressed them back and prevented them from proceeding with their work. Despite a heavy counter fire our torpedo boats were not damaged and the British Naval Forces left the Coast of Flanders.
