Stricter Prohibition Enforcement Obtained By Government Action

Insistence On Co-operation Of Charlottetown And Summerside Police Forces An Important Factor In MacMillan Government's Efforts To Improve Conditions. Amendments To Prohibition Act Pass Committee Stage.

Evidence of stricter enforcement of the Prohibition Law in Charlottetown and Summerside, due to the Government's insistence on obtaining co-operation on the part of the City and Town police forces with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, was given in the Legislature yesterday by Premier MacMillan.

PROHIBITION ACT. On motion of Hon. Mr. MacPhee the House went into committee with Mr. Wigmore in the chair on an Act to Amend the Prohibition Act. Sec. 1 of the bill adds to Sec. 80 of the Act the following provision: "(2) Any inspector, constable or other officer may arrest without warrant any person whom he finds committing any offense against this Act."

Mr. LePage said he was glad to see the Government realized the necessity of more rigid prohibition law enforcement. He thought there should be some amendment with reference to the sale of beer. Last year there were 14,000 cases of beer sold. It was "common knowledge" that bootleggers were getting beer from the vendor's store and selling it, he claimed.

train. Hon. Mr. MacPhee: "I think the member should withdraw that statement." Mr. LePage explained that he intended no reflection on the members, but that they should not have to sit alongside of persons who were drinking and blaspheming. Hon. Mr. MacPhee: "Then I apologize to the hon. member. When he suggested that we police the trains because the members were travelling back and forth, I thought he was suggesting something that he should withdraw, but I see it was not for their disciplining but for their protection that the suggestion was being made." (Laughter).

CITY POLICE CO-OPERATING. Premier MacMillan, replying to the suggestion of Mr. Allen that there was evidence of law violation in Charlottetown, pointed out that every day in that town several arrests are made. In some cases suspected premises are searched four and five times in one day. "For the last year at least," he added, "the City Police have been active in co-operating in the enforcement of the Prohibition law."

MOORE RIGID ENFORCEMENT. Owing to the more rigid enforcement of the Act in recent years the Attorney General explained, bootleggers, instead of keeping a large quantity of liquor on hand, as was formerly the case, take very small deliveries and keep only a small quantity about their persons. It is to get after these people that the section is intended.

SEARCH OF PREMISES. Sec. 4 adds to Sec. 126 of the Act the following provision: "The occupier of any premises in respect of which a conviction has been obtained under this Act, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months, or both."
