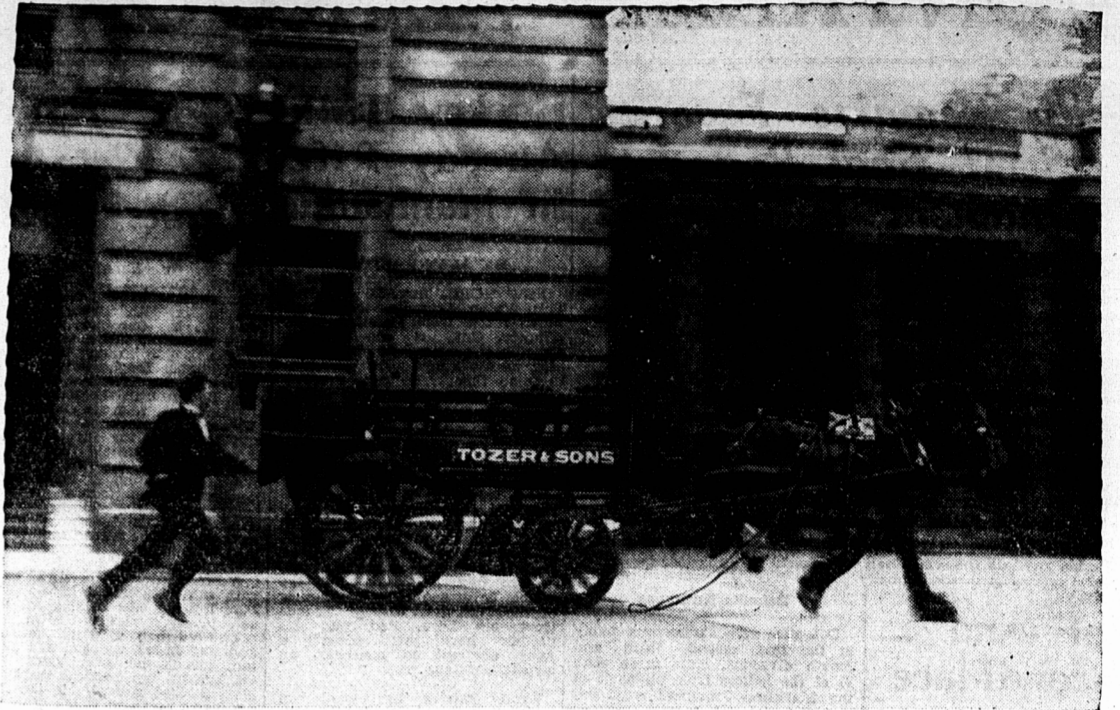


# NEWS of the WORLD in PICTURES

U. S. Secretary of State, whose speech on peace has caused a stir in European capitals.



It is seldom that one obtains a photograph of a runaway horse in action, particularly in the grounds of a royal palace, yet that is what is depicted here. This horse bolted while coal was being delivered at Buckingham Palace in London, sped across the yard and crashed head-on into the railings. The photo shows the driver making a mad dash in an unavailing attempt to halt the frightened horse.

The Duke and Duchess of Gloucester on a visit to the Empire Exhibition at Bellahouston Park near Glasgow, Scotland, missed their train deliberately. The royal couple changed their minds about leaving and visited the amusement park. In the upper picture (left to right) the Duchess, who was wearing a simple floral dress with a navy blue straw hat, loosens her hat as she gets ready for the

scenic railway ride, removes it before the rail car leaps into motion and hands it to an attendant; puts her hair into position as the car begins to move and still smiling and hatless leaves her seat in the rail car after the ride.

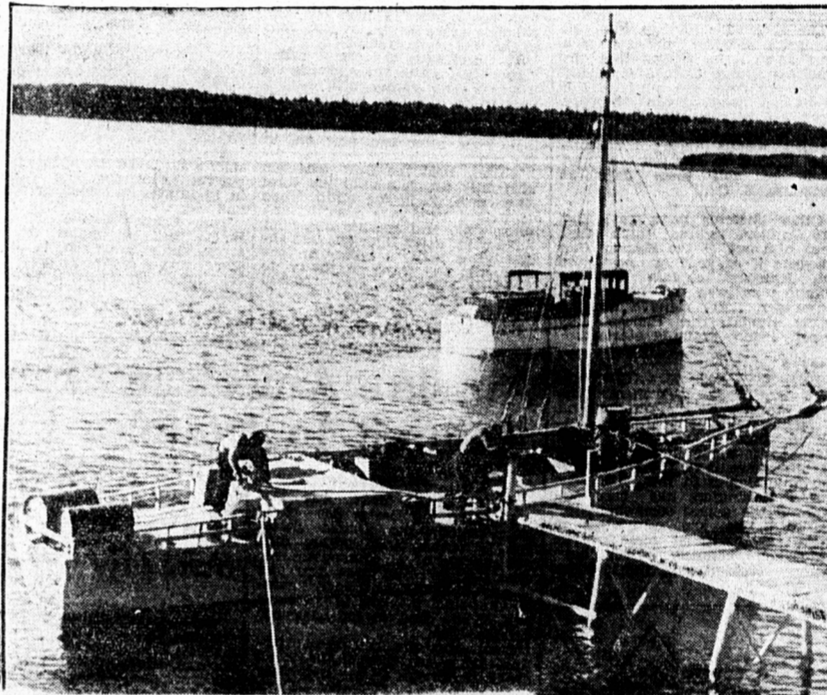
The lower picture shows the Duke and Duchess in their "bump-car" on the speed track.

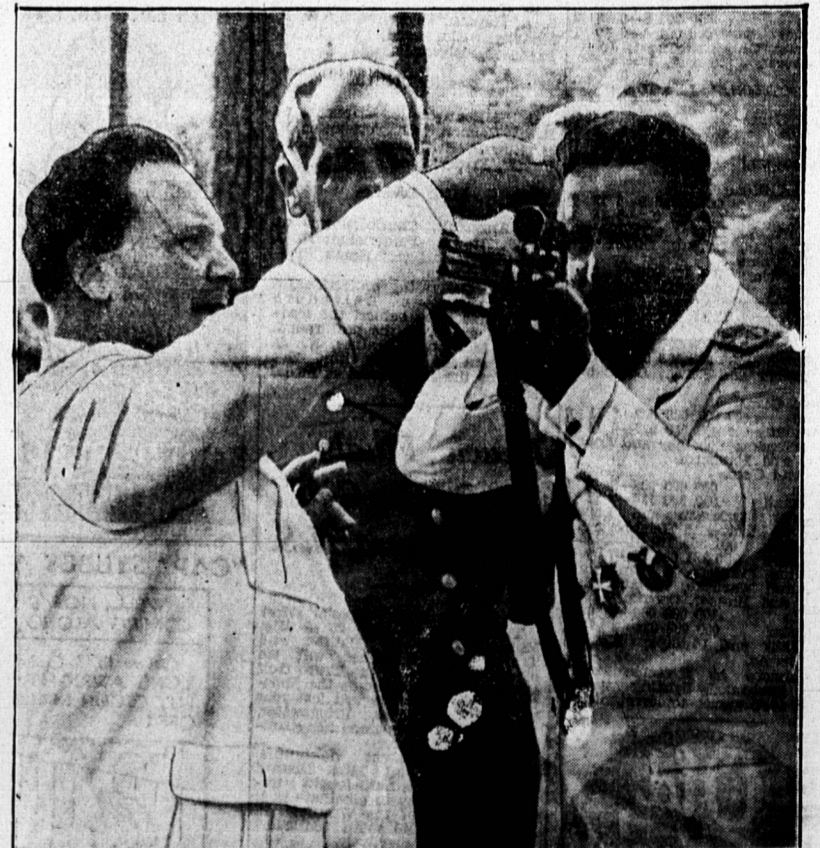

Thirteen days after he married the former Laurine MacDonald, a former telephone operator, Daniel G. Dodge, 21 year old heir to a \$9,000,000 fortune, was drowned near Little Current, in Ontario, when being terribly mutilated by a dynamite blast, he was being taken to hospital in his speed boat. Dodge fell from the boat and vanished before the speedy craft could be turned. Several others, including Mrs. Dodge were injured at the camp where Dodge was honeymooning since his marriage on August 2. Our photo shows the couple at the time of their wedding.



One of the daily bombing planes crashed in one day near San Diego, with a toll of seven dead and one injured. Shown on the crane is the plane in which two fliers met death, while on the barge platform is the wreckage of another machine from which the crew escaped.



German-Italian accord was given another boost recently when Air Marshal Italo Balbo, governor-general of Italy's colony in Libya, was the guest of German Field Marshal Herman Goering, at the latter's country home, Carinhall,

in the Schortheide, just north of Berlin. In this photograph Field Marshal Goering adjusts the sights of one of a hunting rifle for his guest, who spent much time shooting on the grounds of Carinhall.
