OUR SHARE IN THE LANDS OF THE NORTHWEST.

The question of our share in the lands of the Northwest presents a two-fold aspect, first with regard to the lands within the present boundaries of the three Provinces in the prairie country and secondly with respect to the large territories which it is proposed to annex to Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba.

In regard to the lands now held by the Dominion within the prairie Provinces it is to be observed that each of these Provinces at their creation was given compensation in the way of an extra subsidy in lieu of the lands which were retained by the Dominion. It is now the declared policy of the Government of the day to hand over these lands to the Provinces in which they are situated. Two adjustments will become necessary when this transfer shall be made. These lands are valuable and the value belongs to all the Provinces. It would be most unfair for the three Provinces to which these lands are being given to retain the additional allowance which they are given in lieu of lands, unless an additional allowance is made to the other Provinces to balance the account.

The other question as to the new and large areas proposed to be annexed to Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba is one which is of especial interest to the three Eastern Provinces. These areas are, as in the case of the lands within the provin-

cial boundaries in the west, the property of all the people of Canada, and should not be given away without compensation to those whose proprietary right is so unquestionable as is ours. And clearly the beneficiaries of the deal, that is Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba, should make good this compensation. It ought not to be taken out of the general treasury of the Dominion, which is also a common property.

Be it observed that these vast areas are, on the ground of geographical proximity, much more valuable to the big Provinces upon which it is proposed to bestow them than to the Eastern Provinces. They form a hinterland of Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba, and can be better administered by them than by the Governments of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick or Prince Edward Island. We are not likely to ask for the annexation of Kewatin or Ungava to our limited maritime domain. We cheerfully admit that it is more convenient that the vast Northland refer to shall, in due time and under fair conditions, fall into possession of the adjacent Provinces. But compensation for our share in the value of the now undivided estate must be in condition precedent to the transfer. And those in charge of our interests here and at Ottawa, will be held to strict account as to the firmness with which they shall insist upon that vital and important condition.

The game of politics is becoming pretty lively in Ontario in view of the near approach of a general provincial election. The Toronto Globe in a leading editorial article speaks of Sir James Whitney's "cheap and bumptious insolence," "his violence of speech becoming only to a hooligan," and "his cheap vulgarity that would ill become a bar-room loafer."

On the other hand The News of the same city tells that in 32 constituencies out of 106 only two weeks before election day there are yet no Liberal candidates. After all, courties between parties in the big Province seems about as skimpy as it is here in Prince Edward Island.

NOTES.

It is now known that in July last Great Britain and Germany were on the very brink of war over the Agadir incident. Germany had demanded the dismissal of the British Chancellor, Lloyd George, a demand which Premier Asquith and his colleagues refused to consider, and practically the decks were cleared for action on both sides. Britain, on an understanding with France, was prepared to send 150,000 troops to the continent. This would make it appear that the entente between Great Britain and France is in everything but the name an alliance offensive and defensive.

The whirlwind campaign to raise

be dependant upon the Government's winter steamers alone for months to come for transportation to and from the outside world. The great concern in the public mind in this connection is whether we are also to be subjected during the winter to the three short-haul rate for freight as we were under the old regime. We are bound to assume, as we cheerfully do, that the new Government desires to deal fairly with this Province; also we do not forget that the new Ministers have very recently come into power and that since their advent they have had many important matters of state to occupy their attention. But we cannot be oblivious of the fact that it would be most unjust to continue the oppressive rates heretofore in vogue on the Government railways and steamers during the coming winter, or for one day longer than is necessary to make a change in the freight schedules. And that ought not to take very much time. It is to be observed that as soon as the winter steamers take up the work, the entire machinery of transportation between this Province and the Mainland, as also between all Island points and Sydney, Halifax, St. John and other Canadian cities, is owned and operated by the Government of the Dominion. There is no question of divided control or responsibility. The Government will have it all to do and cannot be divested of the full accountability for the efficiency of the service and the fairness of the rates. The change from the Steam Navigation Company's steamers to those of the Government ought to be signalled by the adoption of a fair through rate, which should not be more than is charged for an equal distance on the Intercolonial with the cost of transshipment added. This seems to be so fair and reasonable a proposal that we can see no just cause for not adopting it at once or any reason for a single week's delay in putting the new order into operation when the winter steamers take up the service.
