### Morgan Is Released From U.N.R.R.A. Post; Cohen Is Acting Chief

(By Wes Gallagher) BERLIN, Aug. 20—(AP)—Director-General La Guardia of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration announced tonight the release of U.N.R.R.A. chief Herbert Morgan as acting chief of U.N.R.R.A. displaced persons operations in Germany, and appointment of Meyer Cohen, director of U.N.R.R.A. repatriation in Washington, as acting chief succeeding him.
