INSTITUTE MEETING.

(From yesterday's Evening Guardian)

The Cornwall Farmers' Institute met in annual session at Cornwall Hall on Saturday evening, Dec. 20th. The President, Mr. Elmer McMillan, occupied the chair. After the reading of the minutes of last meeting, the President delivered his address which was very interesting, reviewing the work of the Institute since its organization some three years ago. Mr. McMillan said in part: "I think by our work we have justified our existence in the community in which we live. We have bought imperial registered stock for the three sections represented here, two animals were supplied during the year to the North River section. One of these animals represents one of our best dairy breeds; the other representing the most popular beef breeds. ... During the year we got wholesale cuts on farm seeds and blader twine which in doubt paid our Institute fees many times over."

After referring to the social gatherings and the picnics at the Experimental Farm last summer, Mr. McMillan said that the Farmers' Institute is a co-operative association in which all work together for the common good thus it helps to foster a spirit of unselfishness. This year they had the largest membership yet and next year promises to be better. The farmers should take advantage of the present high prices of farm products, and raise all the best that can be produced, to feed the people who do not raise these things. In conclusion the President referred to the good work being done by the Ladies' Institute of Cornwall, North River and West River. The Secretary then read his report which was on motion adopted.

The following are the directors elected for the ensuing year. Meadow Bank—Lemuel Drake, Pope Crosby, Hammond Crosby, North River—Walter Scott, Waldo Bain, Wm. McKinley.

Cornwall—Samuel Abbott, David Scott, John McLean, Prof. Theodore Ross. Superintendent of Institutes then delivered a very forceful, eloquent and instructive address on Agriculture. After some remarks on the work of the Departments the Short Course, the Long Course and the Domestic Science Course, he said that the farmers of today need to learn a little more of the science of agriculture. It is necessary to improve the fertility of the soil and to grow larger crops, as it is the last few bushels of the crop that pays the price.

He urged the importance of improving the fertility of the soil by returning material to it by feeding all on the farm. The farmer should be sure that his seed is good, and should select large plump grain. The farmer should apply business principles to his work, by getting into line with the best grades of seed and salable stock.

The professor spoke at considerable length on the feeding and care of milk cows. Much improvement can be made all branches of farming.

(1) By the feeding of properly balanced food rations so as to get the best returns. (2) By conserving the manure and applying it so as to get the best return with smallest possible loss. (3) By growing from the soil crops that will give the largest returns.

On motion of Mr. Wm. Crosby seconded by Mr. Geo. McDonald the thanks of the Institute were tendered Mr. Ross for his address. Mr. Ross then made a suitable reply after which the meeting closed.




