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Maritimer Receives International Honor

The first Canadian ever to win the award Professor H. Jernatt will receive the Astor-Gold Medal and a Thousand Dollar prize at the 1946 Congress of the Electrochemical Society, to be held in Toronto, October 16-19.

The Schone Medal and Prize, founded by Dr. Edward Goodrich Acheson, inventor of carborundum, is the highest award in the field of electrochemistry. It is presented annually to the author of the most important paper published in the field of electrochemistry.

Dr. Jernatt, who has been working at the National Institute of Standards since 1940 for his work on sugars. He is the author of the book "Principles of Electrochemistry" which has gone through four editions.

Born at Dartmouth

Dr. Jernatt was born in Dartmouth, N.H. in 1886. He attended Dartmouth University at Hanover, N.H., receiving his Bachelor of Science degree in 1908 and his Master of Arts degree in 1910. He then was awarded a fellowship to the University of Cambridge, where he spent the next two years at the Cavendish Laboratory. He received his Master of Science degree there in 1912.

He then spent a year at Heidelberg University and another year at the Polytechnicum at Zurich, Switzerland, where he received his Doctor of Science degree. He returned to the University of Cambridge in 1914 and lectured on physical chemistry until 1917 when he was invited to Swarthmore College, Pennsylvania. He has headed the Chemistry Department of Swarthmore since 1918. The Franklin Institute awarded him the Lester K. Jernatt Medal in 1918; and the Howard N. Potts gold medal in 1939 in consideration of his distinguished work in developing a process for the electrolytic reduction of simple sugars on a commercial scale.

In Dr. Jernatt's process, glucose is converted into sorbitol. Sorbitol has two principal values: first, as a moistening and softening agent; second, as an intermediate in chemical synthesis. The most important derivative at present is ascorbic acid (vitamin C).
