EARTHQUAKE CAUSED FIRES

Court Decides in Favor of Insurance Companies in Suit.

LONDON, May 25.—The question whether the fire which practically destroyed the city of Kingston, Jamaica, in January of 1907, broke out before or after the earthquake, was decided in the King's Bench Division today in favor of the insurance companies. The insurance companies claimed that the earthquake caused the fires and that consequently they were protected under the earthquake clauses in their policies. The present case, which was brought by a Manchester firm against the London & Lancashire Company, has occupied the attention of the court for the best part of the month. Many witnesses were brought from Jamaica and leading counsel were engaged on both sides.

BIGGEST EGG EATER IN THE WORLD.

DENVER, COLO., MAY 25.—Miss Pearl Leckhard has established a claim as the greatest egg eater in the world. She managed to consume four thousand in a year. From a small beginning she has increased her consumption to a dozen eggs a day. Joseph Wings, of St. Louis holds the record for short-distance egg eating, with twenty-five in sixty seconds.

KING AND CZAR TO MEET AT LAST

For the First Time Since Accession to British Throne.

LONDON, May 25.—The foreign office issued to-night the following: "The King has arranged to pay a state visit at Whitsuntide to the Emperor of Russia at Reval, where he expects to arrive on the royal yacht Victoria and Albert, escorted by two cruisers, on June 9. This is the first visit his Majesty has been able to pay since his accession to the throne to the emperor, to whom he is closely allied by ties of friendship and near relationship." The secretary with which the visit has been arranged, the comparative shortness of the notice, and above all the fact that it is announced by the foreign office instead of by the court and that it is a state visit are circumstances which are regarded in some quarters as bestowing special political importance on the journey, the more so as it immediately follows the visit to England of President Fallieres of France.

AIR HIP 135 MILES AN HOUR

Progress Being Made In the Flight of the Aeroplane.

HAMMONDSPORT, N. Y., May 25.—J. A. D. McCurdy handled Baldwin's airship, "White Wings," in her fifth flight here today. One hundred and eighty-three yards was covered in 10.35 seconds, the machine travelling at the rate of 135 miles an hour. The maximum height was about 20 feet. Quite a strong quartering wind was blowing which McCurdy did not correct for by his lateral controls, this being his first trial, causing the machine to career and strike her right wing. She then turned turtle, pivoting on the nose and finally rested on her top plane with engine and wheel in air. The central panel was so strongly built, however, that it remained intact, the engine staying fast on its bed. Neither operator nor the engine was in the least injured. The machine itself, was, however, badly damaged, and it will take a couple of weeks to complete repairs. This flight was the fifth made by the "White Wings" which has now travelled a total of 674 yards in the air.

MADE LONG THROW BUT COST HIS LIFE

ST. LOUIS, Mo., May 25.—Anxious to make up for an error previously committed, John R. Barry, an amateur baseball player, today put forth great efforts in a long throw from deep left field to the home plate, during a game between two local baseball teams, and he burst a blood vessel and fell dead as the ball reached the catcher and put out the player who was trying to steal home.

JAPAN KEEPS HER PLEDGES

New Consul General Instructed to Discourage Immigration.

OTTAWA, May 25.—The new Japanese Consul General for Canada, Mr. Shimizu, has informed the government that his instructions from Tokio on assuming the new office, were to discourage any further influx of Japanese into Canada. Mr. Shimizu is personally opposed to Oriental migration to the continent, on economic and political grounds and this fact coupled with his instructions from the Japanese government last January, respecting the limitation of Japanese emigration to Canada, is being faithfully kept. Every indication this year and every report received by the immigration department points to the fact that the question of Asiatic immigration has now been satisfactorily settled as far as the country is concerned.

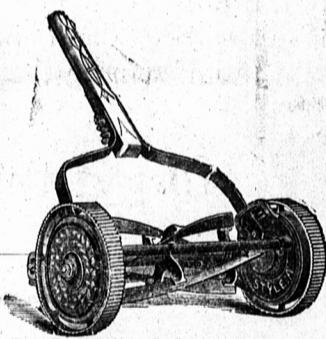
