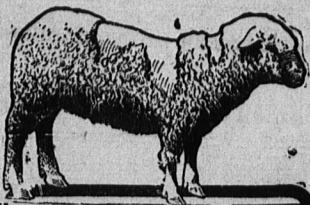

S. S. NORTHUMBERLAND—The s.s. Northumberland arrived at 7.45 Friday. Among the passengers were: Miss Jones and Miss Clarke, both teachers of King's College, Windsor. They intend taking a cottage at Rocky Point, and spending the summer there. Lieut. Cuthbert Simpson, of King's College, son of Canon Simpson, was also a passenger on a visit to his home here.

HORSE RACES THIS AFTERNOON—The horse races which take place this afternoon on the Charlottetown driving park, have created speculation galore, as to the ultimate winners in the five classes. The horses are very evenly matched, several of them however being new to local speculators. The pony race is eagerly looked forward to especially by the children. The Eighty Second band will be in attendance.

AN OLD RELIC—Mr. John A. Ferguson, Marshfield, the other day picked up a copper coin on his farm which must have lain there for over fifty years. The coin is one of a primitive issue permitted by the government in the early days of the colony to facilitate the making of change, and also used by the issuer as an advertising medium. The coin bears on one side the inscription "Encourage our side" and on the other "cheap family store" in the center and around the circle the words "Robert Purvis, Wallace." The coin although so long buried is in a good state of preservation, the inscriptions being quite legible.

LARGE ORDER—Messrs Carvell Bros., of Charlottetown, are at present supplying an order from the War Office for 1,500 tons of hay. Three very large presses are now constantly at work pressing the hay into bales which average about 90 lbs. so far about 500 tons have been treated in this way. About 45 men are employed on the work, forking the hay, attending the presses, wiring, loading, etc. The presses are run by a 20-h.p. Imperial gasoline engine, in charge of Mr. Norman Watson. After the hay is pressed it is consigned by teams to the warehouse on the Marine Wharf, where it is being stored to be in readiness when the time comes for shipping it. It is understood a special steamer will come here to convey the hay to the seat for war, where it will be used for feeding the horses of the British army. The big presses at the Railway Wharf will be kept going for several weeks still on this contract and a considerable quantity of good quality hay will be purchased. It is evident that the P.E. Island farmer who wants to help the Empire by growing needful products will make no mistake if he devotes a considerable acreage to hay, among other things that are sure to be in demand.

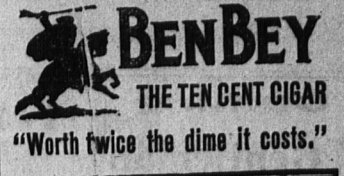
