LONDON, June 5.—J. Bruce Ismay President of the International Mercantile Marine, resumed his testimony before the British Board of Trade inquiry into the loss of the steamer Titanic, to-day. For the most part his replies were terse expressions such as "I don't know," or "That's outside my province." Towards the close of the session Sir Rufus Isaacs, the Attorney General again adverted to Ismay's personal conduct at the time of the disaster, which is perhaps more discussed than any other detail. "You knew that you had not boats enough on the Titanic to accommodate all the passengers and crew,"

asked Sir Rufus, leaning forward with his princeness in his hand. "I did," Ismay replied without hesitation. "So that if all the boats had left the ship there would still be persons on board," pressed the Attorney-General. "When the last boat left the Titanic you must have known that a number of passengers were left on board." "I did."

"Where were these passengers when your boat left?" "I can only assume that they had come to the after part of the ship. I was really not thinking about that." Discussing the light seen in the distance by the survivors, Ismay said his impression was that the lights were not those of the steamer Talloranic because they were a dull white. Lord Mersey, the head of the court asked—"Have you any doubt that the Californian did see the signals from the Titanic?" "Judging from the evidence, I have not," said the witness who then explained that the matter of providing or not providing the ship officers with marine glasses was left to the
