Another Bomb Mystery to Solve

NEW YORK, Sept. 24—After a week had passed without investigators being able to solve the mystery of the Wall St. explosion they were presented today with another mystery. Who placed the package of dynamite in the Reid Avenue Elevated Station in Brooklyn yesterday morning? The package was found by a policeman going strike duty on the Fulton Street line which operated by the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Company. He soaked it in a bucket of water then carried it to fire headquarters in Brooklyn. Later it was taken to a laboratory in Manhattan for analysis. Accounts differ as to whether a spluttering fuse was attached. Some officials reported that Patrolman Santelli who found it stamped out the fuse.

Hon. Dr. Baxter Outlines Programme

ST. JOHN, Sept. 24—Hon. Dr. J. B. M. Baxter, was elected leader of the Provincial opposition last night and made the following statement to the Canadian press. "The Opposition Party, of which I today have been selected leader, will go into the campaign resolved to reenact itself in accordance with the best traditions of its past history. It will stand essentially for prudent administration of resources of the Province, avoiding increase of bonded debt for services which can be met out of the annual revenue; for an increase of that revenue, without imposing an undue burden upon any section of the people; for government on constitutional lines by the people through their representatives and for the recognition of right of all people to share in the administration of the affairs of the Province without any distinction based upon race or class or creed. At the convention of the provincial Opposition held here yesterday Hon. J. A. Murray definitely retired from the leadership.

Connie Mack Says It's the Catchers
