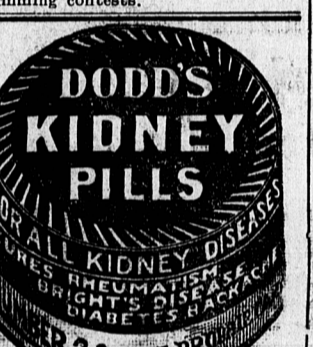

**DIPLOMA WITH HIGH HONORS.**  
HALIFAX, Dec. 18.—H. W. Spurrier, assistant physical instructor, has just been examined for the granting of a diploma for swimming and practical knowledge of life saving. He passed with highest honors. The test took place in the Y. M. C. A. tank and the judges were Dr. A. R. Johnson and P.O. Soules. This diploma is granted by the Royal Life Saving Society and is the highest thing in the swimming world. 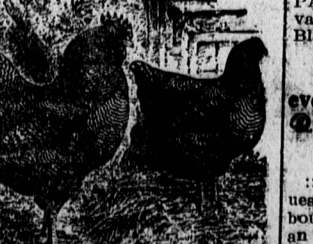

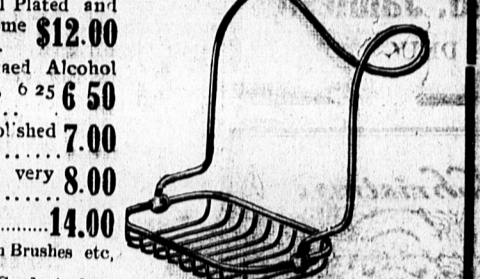
