THE STANLEY MAC.—The schooner Stanley Mac, Capt. Lowrie, arrived yesterday from North Sydney, C. B., with coal to her owners, C. Lyons & Co. She loads a cargo of white oats for Gaudeloupe, West Indies, shipped by Carvell Bros.

WITH bad roads, no sleighing and no jingle of bells it makes Christmas appear dull—in fact it doesn't seem like Christmas at all, taking an outside view. But to cast one glance at Messrs. THE present chief justice of Newfoundland, the Hon. Joseph J. Little, is a native of Charlottetown, P. E. I., and was called to the bar of Newfoundland, in 1859. He entered the legislature of the colony in 1869, and was attorney general from 1870 to 1875. He was appointed a judge of the supreme Court in 1882 and was recently promoted to the chief justiceship. He is a brother of the late Hon. Philip Francis Little, who won responsible government for the colony.—Halifax Herald.

THE market was largely attended yesterday and there was a good supply of meats. Fowl of all kinds, especially geese, were on the market in exceedingly large quantities and high prices ruled. Geese sold from 50 to 90 cents. Other articles ranged in price about the same as last report. Nine of the market stalls were sold by auction for one year and brought unusually large prices. One sold for \$90, another realized \$50 and one \$42 while the others were disposed of at the average figures, ranging from \$16 to \$6. The market will be open again to-day.

The proceeds of entertainment and social will go towards the improvement of the inside of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church. The public are cordially and earnestly invited. Should Thursday be stormy, it will be held on the first fine night following.

THE S. S. Gaspesia will leave to-day for Milford Haven, with a very large freight, being full to the hatches. The cargo in part consists of 1,500 sheep shipped by Messrs. Carvell Bros., E. Wheatley, City, and Mr. Munn, of Marshfield; 100 cattle shipped by Mr. Wheatley; 500 boxes butter shipped by Mr. T. J. Dillon; 100 tons bacon by Messrs B. & M. Rattenbury; 135 bbls. apples by Senator Ferguson; 101 bbls. apples by Mr. John Robertson, Inkerman; 500 tons hay; 10,000 bushels oats and a large amount of other sundry articles. Carrying such an extensive shipment so late in the season direct to the Old Country speaks highly for the promoters and all interested in the inauguration of the service. P. E. Island has reason to-day to feel proud of the fact that so great and successful efforts have been made to gather up and export such large quantities at this hour. It was the best Christmas present that the province could be honored with and it will certainly meet with the appreciation of the public generally.
