FRENCH POWER IS DECLINING

Says Le Nationaliste, and Will Disappear In Twenty-five Years.

MONTRÉAL, Aug. 15.—Le Nationaliste, in a carefully worked-out article, to-day declares that in a quarter of a century the French-Canadian race will be as dead politically in the Dominion as Methu-

Mr. Asselin's paper says that since 1801 580,000 immigrants have reached this country, 573,000 of whom could not speak a word of French.

Le Nationaliste says Lord Durham was no fool and calls him the Lipton of his time. The paper then proceeds to discuss the financial side of the question, claiming that the French-Canadians are paying for their own destruction.

"We contribute one-third," declares Le Nationaliste, "and out of the 580,000 immigrants reaching this country we get 700,000."

"If, in 1931," adds the writer, "Canada having a population of 25,000,000 at least, they decide to cut down the number of members in order to avoid a too numerous parliament, the Quebec representation will be reduced to twenty or thirty out of 100 members. This, therefore, is where our policy of compromise will lead us in a quarter of a century from now."

On the whole the organ of the Quebec Nationalists claims that there is a deep conspiracy on the part of the department of the interior to anglify the Dominion.

CHURCH SERVICES STOPPED BY MOB

MELBOURNE, August 15.—A disgraceful scene occurred in the Scots' church on Sunday, when the labor leader "Tom" Mann, led a crowd of unemployed into the building during the services.

The mob attempted to carry a red flag into the building, but was restrained. Mr. Mann was then informed that seats had been reserved for his followers, but when he saw that they were at the back of the church, he called out, "Come up to the front, comrades!" and the "comrades" tramped up to the front.

When the Rev. Dr. Marshall began his sermon the disturbance broke out. He was constantly interrupted with cries of "roy!" One of the leaders of the demonstration stood up and shouted: "Christ said, 'Sell all that ye have and give to the poor.'"

At this the mob cheered wildly, and when the uproar had subsided, Dr. Marshall stopped the service and went into the vestry. The regular churchgoers left the building, but the intruders remained, passing ribald remarks at the people as they walked down the aisle. After a while three cheers were given for social revolution. The crowd left the building and held a meeting outside.

STORY OF THE COCOS TREASURE

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 15.—Another expedition is on the way to seek the fabled treasures of Cocos Island. There are few truces more firmly established than that the island has no treasures, but at legend to the contrary exists, and what is mere truth?

According to the story, told first by a sailor, he had been one of a pirate crew to seize a gold laden vessel, murder all not in the plot and then get wrecked on Cocos, a desolate and remote spot in the South Pacific.

There they buried the treasure and fought over its ultimate division until there were but three survivors. These were rescued, but did not dare reveal the secret.

The two most wicked died, and the solitary owner of the board had no means of getting back to the place, being afraid to confess that he was a robber and murderer, and anyhow averse to sharing with other rogues.

This, therefore, is what the French-Canadian people have come to after centuries of conflict and labor. They have resisted the tomahawks, bayonets, and even the scaffold, to succumb before undermining influences of Durham and his disciples.
