

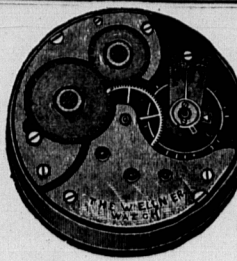

At the auction of the McKenna property on Thursday, no sale took place as the price offered was not large enough. The highest bidder was Edward Kelly, who offered fifteen hundred dollars.

The large mud-scows of the dredge Prince Edward were launched yesterday. Everything along the waterfront is being made ready for the sea. The S. S. Harland is expected to be launched today.

Rev. A. J. McLeod who will have charge of the Y. M. C. A. Evangelistic services tomorrow is a very forceful speaker, having had splendid success as an evangelist in the United States. Everyone is invited to the meetings tomorrow.

The death occurred somewhat suddenly of pneumonia, at Mount Stewart on Tuesday last, of W. J. Logan, at the advanced age of seventy years.

Mr. Logan was a scholarly gentleman of sterling character, a good neighbor and friend and his death is much regretted by his relatives and friends. Besides a loving wife, four daughters and five sons are left to mourn, namely:—George and Peter, Cape Nome, Klondyke, Arthur, contractor in Somerville, Mass., Amherst at home and W. A. Logan, Concord, Mass., who arrived home yesterday in answer to a telegram. The daughters are Mrs. Davd Jay, Mt. Stewart, Mrs. R. P. Prior, whose husband is manager and director of the Bell Telephone Co., in Beaumont Mass., Mrs. Duncan McIntyre, Warden, Idaho and Miss Minnie Logan in New York. The funeral takes place this morning to St. Andrew's church at ten o'clock.

Among the passengers to this City yesterday by the S. S. Minto, was W. A. Logan, Concord, Mass., en route to attend the funeral of his father the late W. J. Logan, of Mt. Stewart. Mr. Logan is Steward of Concord Reformatory, in which are incarcerated some ten hundred and thirty-five persons of all nationalities. The position is a very responsible one. Mr. Logan, besides being head of a staff of sixty-five officials, is present at all surgical operations besides being responsible for the entrance of all persons into the Reformatory and their general welfare. Mr. Logan, with his wife, who was Miss McLean of Dundas, and his son Ralph and daughter Helen, resides in the Concord State House, and receives a salary of two thousand a year. It is six years since Mr. Logan visited his native Province and he will remain home until Monday next to renew old acquaintances.

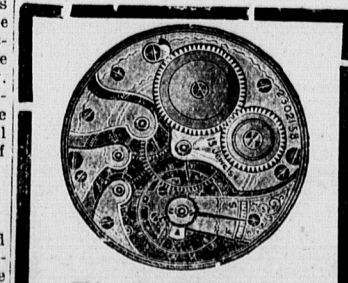
