PEMBROKE IS LIGHTING UP

AND INCREASING ITS INDUSTRIES

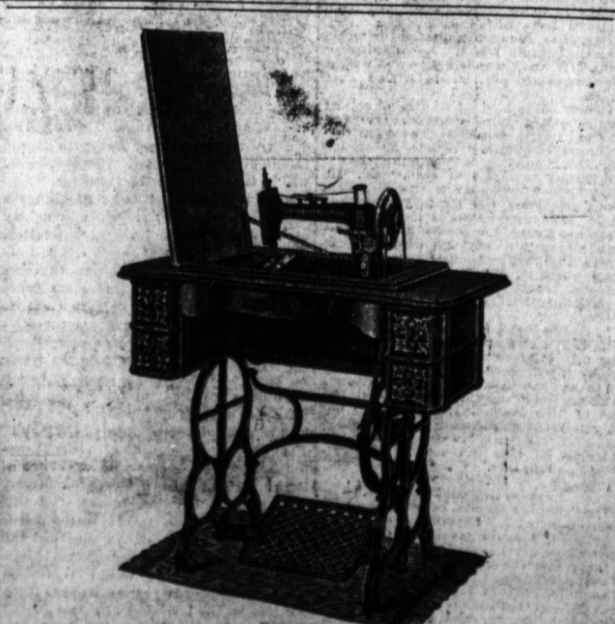
