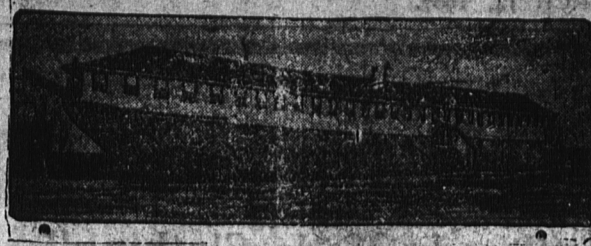

ADDRESS OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE PROVINCIAL ALLIANCE

Continued from page 1.

In the last moments of the last session of parliament, too, some changes were made in several clauses of the Act which were not fully considered and which have so far tended to lessen its effectiveness. It will be the duty of this conference now to consider some necessary amendments to the law, suggested by its operation, and forwarded by the Special Alliance Committee and the other temperance bodies of the Province. It is not to be expected that every hole will be closed on the offender at once, or that one hole closed, by means of human ingenuity or under the inspiration of the Evil One, may not open another in the law whereby to escape. Our duty is to be ever vigilant; to take notice of the breaches in our fortifications, to repair them promptly and also to strengthen the weak places in them, as best we can. We have one of the very best measures of the kind on any statute book; so long as we operate it honestly, just so long will it prove the bulwark of temperance here, and be the model on which other Provinces are falling into line. The leaders in the public circles of Nova Scotia have consulted with us on several occasions already as to the value of our Prohibition Act, and we have recommended it heartily to them. So have the New Brunswickers. And the Temperance people of Nova Scotia have a measure framed now based on our ready to be presented at the present session of their legislature. We may look for amendments such as it is not only here in Maritime Canada, but all over the Federation and beyond. The effectiveness of such a measure consists in this that the people are able to make it vital quickly by securing at once the additions and eliminations which the changing conditions of the country and the vagaries of the trade demand. Those changes may be agreed on now, we hope to present to the Government immediately so as to be passed into law, while at the same time we want to secure the consideration of the law to the attention of the law-makers. To the question of "How does the Act work," put to us from without, we have been able to answer confidently "Admirably," for surely it is admirable to be able to suppress that drunkenness and all other evils arising from the illegal traffic in intoxicants have diminished at least 50% in our midst in the short time since the law has been extended to the whole Province; and this in the face of incapable officers, in some cases at least. It has been exceedingly hard to get anything worthy of an active administration of the law outside the capitals often; and the methods of the official in dilly-dallying, in temporizing with offenders, in expediting in the extreme, in Prince County we had no jail for a long time, and this was taken advantage of by the lawless, to a very great extent. The non-payment of fines too, has constituted something of a mystery to the annihilated.
To our mind there is no doubt but that the word has gone forth among the violators of the law that no fines are to be paid, and the expenses consequent upon the operation of the law thrown altogether on the Executive. "We will see" they seem to say, "how long the Government will fork over dollars they want so badly, to pay inspectors, magistrates and bailiffs, to enforce a non-revenue producing enactment." So they decide to go to jail. Well we are better pleased to see them go there any day than to pay fines and keep right on selling liquor. The jail is the right place for them. It is the only recourse offered by the proposed Nova Scotia law, and it is the penalty they are incurring here, even after the second chance is turned to naught. They will soon tire of it too. Those people think they know that the hearts of our legislators are not in the measure they have passed and consequently that they will not long stand by it. As well charge them with want of honest purpose in any other law enacted. Honest or not, they have served the public cause and the public if properly grateful is jealous of its rights and will safeguard them fully.
But even if it were so, even if our legislators grew concerned when fines failed to fill the public coffers, even if secretly their sympathies were with the enemy (such the thought) what would be the result? The people are the supreme masters in the matter. They are bound that illicit liquor selling be banished and in as far as can be they will see to it that the law be fairly operated, amended where necessary and made to reduce to its least possible contravention, consonant with the Federal regulation permitting its importation and manufacture, no matter the party in power. The Government which would say "Collect fines enough or we will reverse the law" could not hold on to office 24 hours in this Province. The people who pay the expenses of operation recognize that there is something away beyond the mere expense of money in this matter. Who will attempt to compute in dollars the blessings which even enforced sobriety bring to any state? The many advantages are so infinitely superior to mere revenue that nobody stops to compare them; Government would refuse to ensure them under the law even if never a dollar were returned in fines. As we said other Provinces are considering the enactment of this law with-out the option of fines at all. No direct revenue is there sought to recompense officials. The law is worth its greatest cost as any other good law is worth its fullest protection. We are not satisfied with abstractness, with mere ideals; we are men laboring for results. Fines are imposed because so many violators of this class a chance to mend their ways. If he will not then the day comes; and comes quickly, when in prison he may meditate upon his perversity, for no money tender can save him from
