IN MEMORIAM

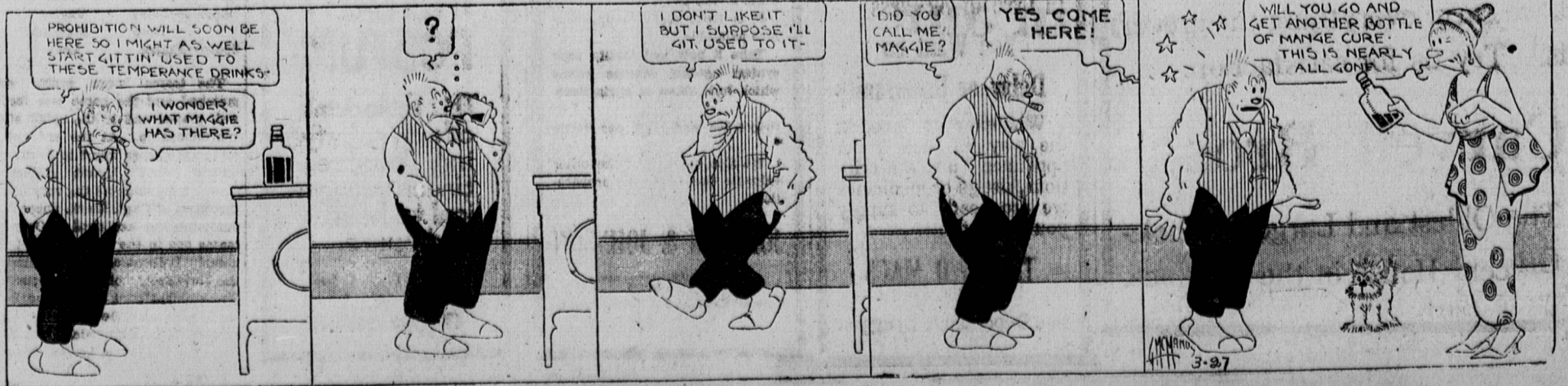

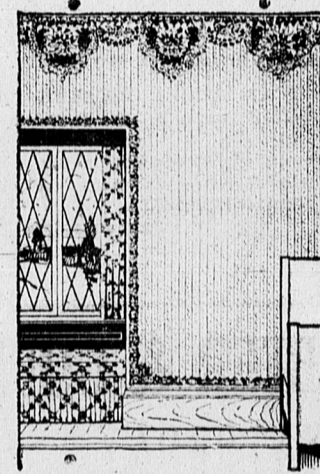
