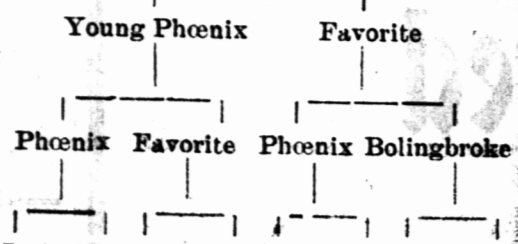

In this case it was a decided success, producing an animal of marvellous prepotency; but in the end Collings ruined his herd, destroying their constitutions and fixing their defects. In the same manner both the Baltes and Booth herds were all but ruined, and Amos Cruickshank rather than introduce the system into his herd as he would have been compelled to do, dispersed them. Line breeding in the hands of a professional may succeed, with an amateur is dangerous but in-and-in breeding has always brought disaster.

United States exports were valued at \$1,453,000,000 and those of Great Britain at \$1,413,000,000. Germany coming third with \$1,060,000,000. In 1875 the United States had the fourth place, with \$497,000,000, while Great Britain exported \$1,087,000; France, \$747,000,000, and Germany, \$607,000,000. In the quarter of a century the United States has gained 194 per cent., Germany 58 per cent., Great Britain 30 per cent., and France 5 per cent."

**HOW BOERS GET SUPPLIES.**

UITENBRAFICE, Cape Colony March 2.—Mr. Lotter member of the house of assembly his son and form who were arrested recently have received their preliminary examination. **LIPTON IS SATISFIED.**

LONDON, March 2.—The reply of the New York Yacht Club to the latest suggestions from this side on the subject of the International yacht race, reached the Royal Ulster Yacht Club yesterday. The answer clears up the ambiguity in regard to the starting, and provides that the time of the boat first crossing the line after the starting gun shall be deemed the starting time. The New York Yacht Club also gives the Shamrock II. three weeks' grace in the event of unforeseen accidents. But the first race must not be later than August 27.

**COMPLICATIONS ARE GROWING.**

NEW YORK, March 2.—A special cable to the Herald from Porto Plata, Santo Domingo, says: "The Santo Domingo minister of war, who is at Monte Christo, has sent a war vessel to this port for reinforcements and artillery, which are to be sent to the frontier territory in which the recent disturbances occurred. It is announced that the government will send 6,000 men to the front. Complications are said to be growing."
