ENGLISH BIBLE'S TRICENTENARY

LONDON, March 25—Throughout the British Empire preparations are completed for the fitting observance of the tricentenary of the authorized version of the English Bible.

celebration. The exhibition will be divided into two sections, manuscripts and printed books. The manuscripts will illustrate the progress of the Bible from the very earliest times, starting with examples of the Hebrew and Greek originals, and going on to the Latin Vulgate, which brought the Bible into England.

The churches of every denomination in Great Britain, and in fact, all English speaking countries, will join in the observance of the English Bible's birthday.

The celebration will not be confined to this city. In the course of the week meetings will be arranged in leading provincial centres in Scotland and Ireland, similar to the large mass meeting to be held in the Royal Albert Hall on Wednesday.

In connection with the interesting celebration the authorities of the British Museum have arranged an exhibition of a historical character which will attract the attention and hold the interest of thousands of Bible scholars who will visit London during the tricentenary.

On July 22 of the same year, he called the same scholars together once more and charged them with the task of making a new version of the Bible, based upon the Bishops' Bible, from which they were to deviate only where absolutely necessary.

The exhibition will include a specimen of practically every Bible in the museum, excluding, however, mere translations into foreign languages of the authorized version.

SUFFRAGISTS HOPE DESPITE REVERSE

NEW YORK, March 25—Despite the defeat of two bills striking the word "male" from the suffrage clause of the State constitution by the Judiciary Committee of the Senate on Tuesday, leading woman suffragists of this city refused to admit yesterday that the suffrage cause was lost for this year. They insisted that their hopes that the remaining suffrage bill will be reported to the Legislature by the Judiciary Committee are as bright as ever.

At the headquarters of the woman suffrage party, in the Metropolitan Building, there was agitation yesterday morning among the women, who, not realizing at first that there is still another bill to be passed upon, were convinced that the cause was without hope for the present session at Albany. Leaders of the movement soon explained that the Newcomb resolutions which were defeated were not really expected to be passed but the Stillwell bill, which is a compromise of the two, will be reported to the Legislature.

"We have enough pledges from the members of those committees to assure the reporting of the bill," said Mrs. James Lees Laidlaw, chairman of the woman suffrage party for Manhattan. "There was a good deal of opposition to the Newcomb bills for various reasons, but the woman suffrage party endorsed all the bills. The Stillwell bill, which is yet to be passed upon, alters the suffrage clause in the constitution as it now is only by striking the word 'male' from the constitution and adding 'except that a citizen by marriage only must have resided in the United States for five years.' It was the question of giving the alien women the vote which made many persons oppose the Newcomb bill."

Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, head of the woman suffrage party in this city, said that she had not expected the Newcomb bills to pass, but that she has every expectation that the Stillwell bill will be reported.

Miss Harriet May Mills, president of the State Association for Women Suffrage, who has been in Albany in the interest of the bills, also said yesterday that the Stillwell bill is the one on which the suffragists have chiefly centered their hopes and she believed it would pass.

"It doesn't matter which bill passes," said Miss Mary Garret Hay "as long as one does and we believe it will. They were objections to the Newcomb bills because of the emigration clauses. Personally I approve of the old kind of woman suffrage bill, whose only provision was that the word 'male' be stricken from the constitution, but any suffrage bill is satisfactory." Miss Hay was asked if the women believe that the Judiciary committee of the Assembly might pass the Stillwell bill out of compliment to the women and with the understanding that the Senate committee would defeat it. This possibility she and all the rest of the suffragists interviewed refused to consider.

Besides the possibility that the Stillwell bill may be lost after a complimentary endorsement by one committee, there was a rumor yesterday emanating from the camp of Mrs. Harriet Stanton Blatch, the active agent of the Equal Franchise Society and the political Equality Union in the presentation of the Newcomb bill, that the Stillwell bill will be defeated on the ground that it is unconstitutional because of its alien clause. Mrs. Blatch is still in Albany.

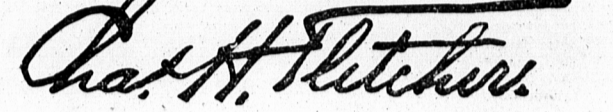
