King Has Given up Riding. LONDON, May 10.—King George has given up his usual morning horseback riding during the crisis. The King began taking gallops every day or so more than a year ago on the recommendation of his physicians after he had suffered from an attack of bronchitis which necessitated a cruise in the Mediterranean. Instead of horseback riding the King now takes a morning constitutional in the five acre gardens of Buckingham Palace. He often walks alone, but frequently there are members of the government with him who desire to discuss the present situation and its developments.

Danger Increasing Every Day. LONDON, May 10.—Every day the general strike lasts increases the danger of an outbreak of violence which would require the use of the nation's armed forces, according to Ronald McNeill, Financial Secretary of the Treasury.

Referring to the strike in a letter read at a meeting of the Canterbury Conservative Association Saturday he said: "This condition of things is a national calamity. It is incumbent upon every loyal man and woman in the country whatever their ordinary political opinions, to rally to the government's support and enable them to avoid unseemable disaster."

Exhorts Catholics to Stand by Government. LONDON, May 10.—At a High Mass at Westminster Cathedral Sunday, Cardinal Bourne called upon Catholics to remain on the side of the government in the present strike movement.
