CONTRACT AWARDED.—A telegram received in Charlottetown yesterday by Messrs Phillips, Mutch and McLean, announced that the contract for Pugwash Railway had been awarded to them.

CITY OF GHEINT LEAVING.—Next Monday the old coaster City of Gheint gets away from Halifax to resume her trade on the north shore, on which she was commissioned by Captain Beattie, who purchased her from Halifax parties last year.

INWARD TRAINS.—Yesterday the eastern express arrived in Charlottetown at 9.30 a. m., on time, the western accommodation at 5.40 p. m., on time; the western at 12.15 p. m., thirty-five minutes late; the southern at 10.20 a. m., twenty minutes late; the Cape Traverse at 10.20 a. m., twenty-five minutes late. The mail special arrived at 12.00 midnight, two hours and ten minutes late.

PROSPEROUS INDUSTRY.—Messrs Bruce Stewart & Co., Ltd., are outfitting a 16 ton motor boat owned by one of the large oyster companies. They are equipping her with a 24-30 H. P. Engine and also a hoist and dredging apparatus. This firm has several orders on their books for gasoline engines from New Zealand which certainly indicates prosperity, and that the fame of the "Imperial" is spreading far. The manufacture of these motors is fast becoming one of the leading industries of Prince Edward Island.

MCELWAIN AND BEATRICE.—The steamer McElwaine, now discharging sugar at Richmond, has been chartered for two trips up from Florida with hard pine, one being, it is understood, to a port in Prince Edward Island. The collier Beatrice, which has lain at the drydock pier for some time pending the effecting of repairs, goes to Port Clyde to load pulp for New London, Conn., and the shippers. The Beatrice may be put on the Sable River Pulp company being the charter for this trade in place of the McElwaine, the boat plying on the route last year.

It is alleged that the clergyman representing himself to be an expert breeder of poultry, and secured money for fancy fowls which he failed to deliver.
