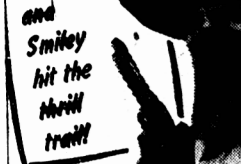

NURSES IN DEMAND - A very grave shortage of nurses prevails in every section of Canada. The problem has become so acute, that efforts on a national scale are being made to induce more young women to enter the nursing profession. Something like 8,000 trained nurses are needed in Canada at the present moment, and the present number of nurses in training is not sufficient to permanently end the shortage.

The National Employment Offices across Canada, under directions from the Deputy Minister of Labour, Mr. Arthur McNamara, are striving to bring to the notice of the public the serious condition with which hospitals are coping due to the shortage. The construction of new hospitals, the extension of public health services in many parts of the Dominion, and the addition of trained nurses to the staffs of many industrial establishments, has widened the field of service of the nursing profession. Where one nurse was needed before the war, two are needed now and new avenues of service are continually opening up.

Viscountess Alexander, wife of the Governor-General will broadcast an appeal Saturday to young women to enter the profession. It is hoped that since the shortage of nurses directly affect Prince Edward Island that there will be a good response.

OTTAWA, Jan. 22 - (CP) - Defence Minister Claxton announced today that Lt.-Col. H. E. T. (Pot) Doucet, O.B.E. of Montreal and Ottawa has been appointed director of public relations for the National Defence Department and that he will hold the acting rank of Colonel. He has been army director of public relations since April 1, 1946.

Col. Doucet's appointment followed disclosure by Mr. Claxton at a recent press conference that public relations was one of the directorates under study for consolidation purposes in line with the present co-ordination and economy drive within the three services.

It meant that in the future he will direct the public relations staffs of Army, Navy and Air Force and that they will be, to a degree, co-ordinated.
