Mixed Trend In Lively Dealing On New York Market

(By Victor Eubank)

NEW YORK, Sept. 11—(AP)—Demand for special stocks served as a balance wheel for today's market although many leaders reverted to the minus ranks. A certain amount of short covering persisted on the idea that the technical rebound had yet to be completed. Again speculation centered on commodities with grains tumbling on talk of hoisted margins. In the share division some textiles and distillers made headway due to the improved earnings outlook in this industry. Numerous customers trimmed accounts because of persistent apprehension regarding possible painful results to business of the living cost spiral, the cloudy export picture and muddled international economics. Ralls inclined to dawdle as the plea for an interim freight rate boost brought no response although the ICC granted a hoist for interstate commutation fares in the eastern territory. Dealings were lively at intervals after an active start but prices wavered here and there in the final hour. Gains of fractions on rail and more were in the majority at the close although numerous pivots ended with declines. Transfers of 800,000 shares compared with 740,000 Wednesday. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 1 of a point, a 64.3 due to the fact that, while advances predominated, a number of the wider losers were in the index. U. S. Gypsum was up 3 points at 100, U. S. Smelting 1-2 at 47 (on raised dividend), Hiram 1-8 at 24 1-8, Schenley 1-3-8 at 30, Du Pont 1 at 189 and Goodrich 1 at 53 1-2. Lesser improvement was retained by Youngstown Sheet, American Woolen, Publicker and Great Northern Soap. Worsted, Chrysler, Goodyear, U. S. Rubber, International Harvester, American Telephone, United Aircraft, Kennecott, Phelps, Dodge, General Electric, Union Carbide, Johns-Manville, N. Y. Central and Great Northern Soap. Bethlehem Steel yielded 1-3-4 at 85 3-4, American Can 1-2 at 83 1-8 and Douglas Aircraft 1-2 at 59. Candaian issues today were steady generally. Distillers Seagram gained 5-8 while Hiram Walker rose 3-8. Dome Mines was up 1-4 and McIntyre was up 1-2. On the curb, Lake Shore gained 3-8 while Giant Yellow eased 1-3-8.

Weekly Markets Report

SUMMARY
Cattle prices were strong to 50c higher under a keen demand and led receipts for the season; hogs sharply higher; calves, sheep and lambs generally unchanged in the past week.
Eastern Cattle Markets
Trading was slow to start on the Toronto cattle market, but activity and strength developed later and the better grades of killing cattle were 25c to 50c or more higher than last week's close. The better grades of killing cattle sold up 50c, with the practical top on weighty steers at \$14.75. Edmonton and good butcher steers \$14 to \$14.50. Barly trading was slow at Montreal but prices eventually settled 25c to 50c higher on all grades except canners and cutters. Two loads of top steers brought \$15.25, good kinds \$14 to \$14.75, and good cows \$9.75 to \$10.75. In the Maritimes the best of the steers and heifers were quoted at \$12.50, f.o.b. country points.
Western Cattle Markets
Deliveries were light for the season in the west and Winnipeg had a record low in cattle deliveries for this time of year. Trade was active and strong on all killing classes throughout western market. Winnipeg had some top steers at \$14 to \$15 but most sales were \$12 to \$13.50; while Calgary was active and most medium to good butcher cattle 25c stronger, with good to choice steers \$13.75 to \$14.75. Edmonton had good action, with the practical top on steers of \$14; Prince Albert up to \$12 on good quality; Moose Jaw \$13 to \$13.50 and \$14; Saskatoon \$13 to \$14; Regina up to \$14; and Vancouver \$13 to \$14.
Exports to United States
Dairy cattle exports to the United States for the week totalled 1,028 head as against 1,330 in the same week last year. Shipments since January 1st this year now total 33,608 and in the same period last year were 47,832.

Papers Active In Otherwise Quiet Montreal Session

MONTREAL, Sept. 11—(CP)—Papers were active and strong in the otherwise quiet industrial section while mines were about mixed on the stock exchange and curb market here today. Range of price changes was narrow. Closing averages of the Montreal exchange listed papers up 2.27 to 33.64; banks off 16 to 27.42; utilities up 6 to 76.7; industrials up 4 to 118.7 and golds up 27 to 79.13. Industrial volume was weak at 33,900 shares while mines continued active with a turnover of 229,500 shares. Dryden continued to trade actively in the papers, once again reaching a new yearly high at 30, ahead 1-4. Brown Common was active, ahead 1-4 at 5, as was Consolidated ahead 1-8 at 17 5-8. B. C. Forest Products pushed ahead 1-8 at 3 5-8, Great Lakes 1-8 at 16, M. and O., 1-4 at 20 1-4, and International 1-2 at 52 1-2. Eldona fluctuated narrowly in the mines throughout the session, closing ahead 2 cents at 114 on a turnover of 50,200 shares. Ashley added 6 cents at 21 while Sullivan lost 5 cents at 200. Other gainers included Cartier Malartic 2, and Hollinger 1-4 point. Losers were Donalds 1, Formque 1-2 and Bob's Lake 1.
