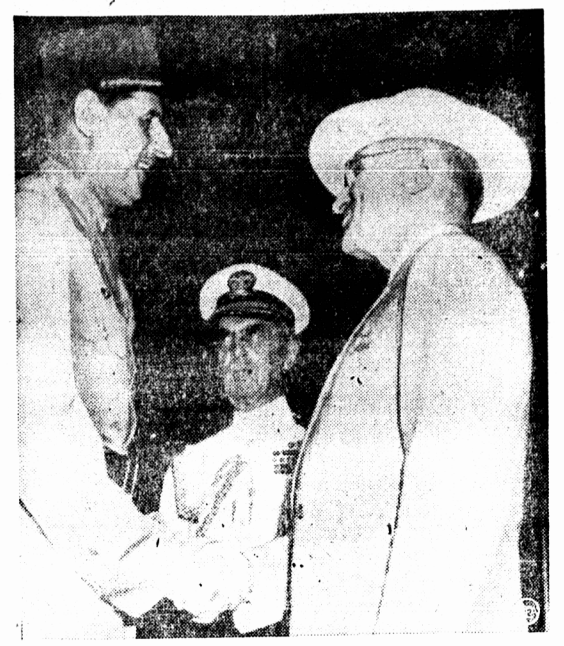

ROUTINE—OLD AND NEW
