THE S. S. Stanley left Summer side yesterday morning for Tormentine and on arrival there took the mails and passenger for the Island. She then sailed for Georgetown, arriving there at 8 p. m. A special train brought the mails to the city about 11 o'clock. The outgoing mail left Charlotte town last night for Georgetown and will cross by the Stanley to Pictou today. The Minto will leave Pictou this morning for Georgetown. Hereafter the steamers will cross each day from Pictou and Georgetown each making one trip each day, and affording daily communication to and from the mainland unless bad weather prevents.

FRIENDS were surprised and shocked to learn of the sudden death of Mrs. John A. Lea, which occurred at Moncton on the 15th after a brief illness. Four days before Mrs. Lea was taken ill with tonsillitis and during the last day or two grew rapidly worse. Yesterday she gave birth to a child and gradually sank until death ensued. Mrs. Lea is survived by her husband, two young children and her mother, Mr. J. W. Hickman, formerly of Amherst but now of Moncton. She was 27 years of age, and was highly respected by many friends. She was well known in musical circles, having been a member of the Central Methodist choir for some time. She was a niece of the late Rev. John Prince and numbered many acquaintances in Charlottetown.

THE will of the late Mrs. Robert Black of Amherst, who was known to many in this Province, was admitted to probate on Tuesday last, the Hon. W. T. Phipps being sole executor. The bulk of the property is left to the executor in trust to dispose of in accordance with private instructions given him. Among other bequests are the following: to the Amherst Baptist church \$500, the same amount to the Home Mission Fund of the Baptist denomination, and \$500 to the Baptist Foreign Missions, \$400 to Acadia College, Wolfville, \$250 to the pipe organ fund of the Amherst Baptist church, \$100, each to two nieces, daughters of the late Stephen Embree of East Amherst and a similar amount to Miss Carter, daughter of the late James Carter of Westmorland Point, N. B. Two children of the late John Harrington, nephews of deceased, and J. M. Carter Jones. The sum of \$400 is bequeathed to Robert Black, son of W. W. Black, a mediator between the husband of Mrs. Black and \$100 to R. V. Dr. Steel, for many years the pastor of the deceased. The estate is worth a good many thousands of dollars.

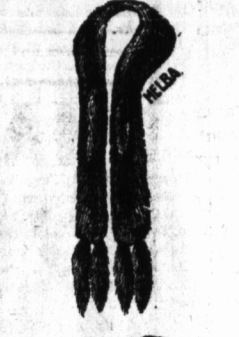
