Lindbergh Called

Wilents called as the next witness the name of Betty Gow, the child's nurse, but immediately changed his mind and called Col Lindbergh.

The flyer gazed over the courtroom as he settled into the witness chair. He described his arrival from New York on the night of March 1. He had dinner with Mrs. Lindbergh. Then they went upstairs and the Colonel took a bath. Then he went downstairs and began reading in the library at the southeast corner of the house, directly under the nursery.

The desk where he sat was beside a window, Col. Lindbergh said. The shutters were open, there was no curtain on the window, and so far as he could see, the room was open to the outside. But he saw no object move past the window.

"Some time during that night did you hear some sort of a noise or crash?" Wilents asked. "Yes, I did," he replied.

The noise, Lindbergh said sounded like the top of a well set an orange box, the top of an orange box falling off a chair which I assumed to be in the kitchen.

He told how his reading was interrupted by the entrance of Miss Gow who asked in an excited voice if he had the baby. He hurried upstairs.

"And from the appearance of the room and from the appearance of the bed I realized that something had gone wrong," he said. "The condition of the bed, Lindbergh added, made him feel it was impossible for the baby to have got out himself. The bulging pile on the bedclothing, caused by the child's body, still was noticeable. The covers still were pinned to the mattress.
