**MR. JOHN FRASER**

The sympathy of their neighbors and many friends is extended to the widow and family of the late Mr. John Fraser, well known and highly respected citizen of Queens County, who died at his home at Avondale on March 18th last. Mr. Fraser was a gentleman of sterling character and more than ordinary ability. He took an active and intelligent interest in all that pertained to the welfare of his native province and country, and always strove to improve conditions in the community in which he grew up and spent his long life of over 80 years.

In religion Mr. Fraser was a devout practicing Catholic and in politics he was a member of the Conservative Party. Possessed of a keen intellect he was fearless and outspoken in defence of his principles and could always be depended on to give a good reason for the faith that was in him.

In Aug. 1887, Mr. Fraser was married to Miss Elizabeth Macdonald of St. Teresa's Parish. A family of one daughter and six sons were born to them, all of whom are living. A family reunion was planned to take place at the old home in August of this year to celebrate the Golden Anniversary of their wedding day, but Divine Providence decreed otherwise.

Besides his widow there are surviving the late Mr. Fraser, his only daughter (Katherine) Mrs. John W. Macdonald of Glenfinnan, P. E. I., Simon and Borden at home, Daniel J. at Indian Head, Sask., David at Odesa, Sask., John A. in Regina and Harold in Vancouver, B. C., and twelve grandchildren.

The funeral which took place to St. Joachim's Church, Vernon River, on March 20th, was, despite the condition of the roads, very largely attended. Rev. Basil Croken of St. Teresa's was the celebrant at the funeral Mass and also conducted the services at the grave. The pallbearers were, J. A. Keoughan, J. J. MacInnis, James L. Macdonald, Leonard Macdonald, Thomas Kelly and L. B. Hughes.—R. I. P.
