"Great is thy faith: be it done unto thee even as thou wilt."—Matt. 15: 28.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

Very important and heart-searching doctrines are found in the gospel narrative between the two lessons and the last. Matthew records two of them and John another. They reveal the essential spirituality of the kingdom of God by the teaching of the absolute necessity of heart-purity for the output of righteousness. Jesus Christ is the health-food of the soul. Ceremonial cleanliness is no sign of inner holiness. All defilement is from within. It comes out of the heart of a man.

The door of salvation to the Gentile world is pushed well ajar in the lesson for to-day, though it was reserved to a later time to fling it wide open. It got its push because the spirit of Jesus cannot and never does resist the pull of sorrow which lifts the pleading voice and hands of faith to Him. There is no way else of accounting for the coming together of Jesus and the Canaanitish woman after fifty miles or more of out-of-the-way travelling. Why else?

Misery seeks relief and knows where it is possible to find it long before the carefree are aware of the existence either of the patient or the doctor. That is how it comes to pass that Jesus could not come into the parts of Tyre and Sidon without having the appeal for help made to Him. Like the newspaper clipping of a cure which was wrought five thousand miles away, found in the bosom of the invalid awaiting a possible chance, so the whispers of the words of Jesus, were treasured by the sorrowful Canaanitish woman until her opportunity might come. How little an effort many would ever know of God if it were not for trouble!

Such faith has nothing hypocritical about it. It will stand testing. Though in appearance it is spurred, it will creep nearer still, and continue to plead and worship. It discerns that in the heart of goodness a delay is not a denial, nor the statement of a creed the belief of it. True faith never denies its Lord. But its ready wit can always point the way out of a difficulty. "Truth Lord!" said the woman. But she added, "Yet."

The disciples thought they were wise friends of their Lord in warning Him that the woman had no claim upon Him. It was an easy snug, surface judgment, parrot-like. But Jesus turns aside their littleness and bigotry by listening to the cry of need which comes to Him from any source and bending to the claims of faith which make appeal from any heart. "Be it unto thee even as thou wilt," Jesus Christ capitulates to faith. He not only surrendered to it but commends it.

Faith always has some problem to grapple with. Its strength is developed by each one that it conquers. And life is made grand by the strength of faith to which the soul has attained. If he is heroic who "breasts the blows of circumstance," if life's progress is marked by defeat of that which tried the soul parts that separate Jesus and the woman of Canaan, and how her sorrow became a joy, when he formed his ladder of graces, beginning thus: "Being, therefore, justified by faith let us," etc. Rom. 5: 1-5.

WINDOW BOXES COME AGAIN

Once more the time of the year has come around when we again add to our windows with flower boxes. Of late years this pretty custom has been steadily in favor. The reason it has not done so even more than it probably is because so many families are out of town for the summer. In London there is scarcely a house in the better part that has not its gay window box in every window, or sometimes only in the street level windows.

These boxes are not difficult to make and should be easy of construction for the home carpenter. They should fit the window exactly, or in cases where the blinds are in the way, they can be arranged to hang below the closing. The prettiest window boxes are those that are the most symmetrical in arrangement. Some should be a decided color scheme followed by the home carpenter. A thick row of white geraniums, nasturtiums in the front is effective. Polka in a window where there is plenty of sun are pretty. Petunias are also most satisfactory, flowering profusely.

While on the subject of window-boxes a word about grass plots may not come amiss. The mass of persons in our city who have lawns, large or small, in front of their houses are too indifferent about them. One sees constantly the grass in front of quite good houses shockingly neglected. It is not cut and weeds are allowed to grow at their sweet will. In some cities there is a positive enthusiasm about keeping the surroundings of the home spick and span, and this aids tremendously to the appearance of the town.

THE HOUSE AND THE MOTOR.

The day may come when the horse will be seen only in the zoological collection, as is the case now in Venice, where otherwise the untraveled could not say they had beheld an animal of that kind. Sir John Macdonald makes the statement that in 1909 there were 450,000 horses in London, while today the number is placed at 110,000. In New York city an average of 250 motor cars are licensed daily. There are over 100,000 automobiles licensed in New York state; the Massachusetts total is above 20,000. With machines being introduced at this rate, one can imagine it will not be long before the horse disappears from our thoroughfares. The machine is already the rule instead of the exception. The submission of the horse to the control of man has been almost absolute. No one who witnesses horses at work daily can fail to wonder at the willingness with which they do their tasks. They walk, trot or run for short or long distances with great docility in most instances. Their usefulness and their gentleness are frequently not appreciated. It is interesting to note that the Philadelphia branch of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals has offered a prize for the "happiest horse" in the workhouse parade soon to be held. The judging will be according to general appearance, taking into consideration condition, shoeing, grooming, hitching and handling.

The least we can do for the faithful equine is to give him kind treatment.

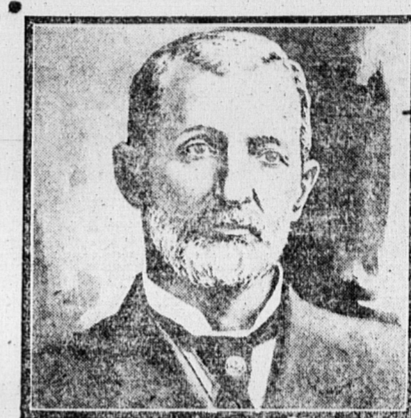
