### Veterans Training News and Views

Imagine one girl in a class of fourteen men that is exactly the situation, however, in what is called the Tutorial Course at the C.V.T. School, Charlottetown. We haven't had any complaint from the lady yet, although there are rumors that power of concentration (academic) has lessened somewhat in intensity since she joined this class early in February.

The Tutorial Course is, as the name suggests, a course of instruction in which each student is tutored or aided by a teacher and progresses quite independently of the other members in his class. In fact, they are all in different parts of different subjects and each one gets his share of the tutor's help. The service men and women who may lack sufficient knowledge to begin on a college course, or to begin on some technical course requiring a high standard in some subject, can join this group for a time, so as to make up their deficiencies. Canadian Vocational Training, a joint project of the Dominion and Provincial Governments, has provided this opportunity for those who are almost, but not quite, fit to embark on the training they wish to secure. Instruction takes place in rooms fitted up especially for this Rehabilitation Training, in the rear of Prince of Wales College. As mentioned last week, the Agricultural Class also uses one of these rooms.

This course began about one year ago with one student, John Sweney of Charlottetown, who is now taking Pre-medical in the regular Third Year class of Prince of Wales College. Mr. Vernon Crockett undertook this work then and is still doing right yeoman service, he being over a much larger group now. Mr. Crockett has a B.A. from Queen's and is well known throughout Charlottetown and Queen's County. He was Principal of Hillsboro Consolidated School from 1907 to 1912, then School Inspector, followed by a few years in World War I. As Principal of the technical school which was operated for veterans of our first Great War, he took a leading part in veteran training, 1909 to 1912. Since that time, Mr. Crockett taught in one of the Accredited High Schools of British Columbia till his retirement last year. A lot of us are glad that we were able to temporarily halt that retirement for a time.

At the number of applicants for Tutorial last year, it is not too heavy for one Tutor, an assistant was engaged and is just now setting under way. He is Mr. James MacDonald, B.A. Laval, Mr. MacDonald, was understanding, in some instances referred to as "Felix". Although short on teaching experience, with service from 1909 to 1908 in Newfoundland and from west Europe. He enlisted first in the P. E. I. Highlanders and was wounded in action.

Veterans who have completed their Tutorial Course here are John Sweney, William Adams, Ernest Jenkins, and Francis Donnelly, all of Charlottetown, and all now attending Prince of Wales College. John Gilmore, Boston's Mills, now at Mount Allison University; Rowland MacEachern, Charlottetown; George Bambeck, Charlottetown, now in St. John, N. B., taking a course in radio; Louis Moore, Summerside, at McGill University; Ralph MacGuigan, Charlottetown, now training in Refrigeration and Air Conditioning at Three Rivers, Quebec.
