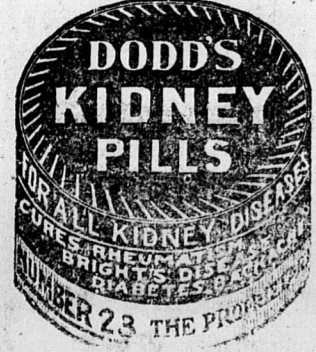

EXTRAORDINARY SCENE AT FUNERAL IN RUSSIA.

MOSCOW, Russia, Feb. 15.—An extraordinary scene was witnessed today during the interment of Count and Countess Milyutin. The Count held the rank of field marshal and was chief aide de camp of the emperor. He was minister of war in the reign of Emperor Alexander II and was the leading champion in the cause of the liberation of the Serbs. The coffins were lowered into the vaults with imposing military honors, but then an awkward situation arose. Both coffins were several inches larger than the apartments in the tombs. Workmen were at once called who attempted to enlarge the openings, but the cement would not yield. The family vault is composed of five compartments, separated by thick cement walls, and it was necessary to blast one of these.

The bodies were temporarily deposited in the chapel, and when the tomb had been enlarged the burial services were repeated, but without a repetition of the military honors. Count Milyutin, who was 96 years old, and his wife, who was 89, died on the same day, the Countess expiring first.

QUIET DAY IN COMMONS.

OTTAWA, February 16.—This has been another quiet working day. For a moment at the outset it looked as if there was to be a debate on cable rates. Within ten minutes of Mr. Speaker's taking the chair of the house was moved into committee supply. Mr. Lemieux rose with the purpose of moving a resolution: "That steps should be taken by the postmaster-general with a view to further reduction in cable rates." However, it abruptly came to a pause, as it was pointed out that J. E. Armstrong, who had a motion on the subject, was not present. The matter accordingly stood over in supply and the proceedings resolved themselves into a series of disconnected episodes.

There was a discussion on the new departmental buildings in Ottawa. The Laurier government, it will be remembered, paid \$700,000 for a long narrow site between Major's Hill park and Sussex street, and then concluded that it was too cramped. OTTAWA, Feb. 16.—A visit from the Duke of Connaught and an important discussion on the question of fruit inspection, and its sale with suggestions for the amendment of the existing inspection and sales act, marked the proceedings of the Dominion Fruit Growers' conference in St. Patrick's Hall here yesterday afternoon.

The duke arrived towards the opening of the afternoon proceedings, and was introduced to the fruit growers by Hon. Martin Burrell, minister of agriculture, who was presiding officer for the session. "I believe that the advancement made in the fruit trade of Canada within the last ten years has been something almost remarkable," declared his royal highness. "I had fruit trees at home and a great deal of trouble and disappointment they used to give me. With care, knowledge and perseverance I am led to think that you ought to succeed with the fruit industry in this fine climate of the Dominion of Canada. At the close of his address, the duke sat down and listened to a large part of the discussion. The Ontario Apple Shippers Association proposed, through a resolution, that the first marks act should be so extended that apples should be inspected at points of shipment and that a sufficient number of qualified inspectors should be appointed, in order that said inspection may be done promptly and efficiently.

The resolution was referred to a committee for consideration. Another resolution from Nova Scotia, similarly dealt with, asked that the dominion government be requested to raise the duty on apples and pears coming into Canada to equal that levied on Canadian apples and pears going into the United States.

FANNING ISLAND WILL NOT BE FORTIFIED

MONTREAL, Feb. 16.—Absolute denial that the British government had purchased the Fanning Island, and were already landing heavy ordnance with a view to the early fortification of the place was given yesterday by Rev. Father Emmanuel Rougier, once the sole owner of the Island.
