The following resolution was passed: Resolved that it is the opinion of this Association that it is highly desirable that a co-operative Association be established to dispose of the rapidly increasing fruit and that a committee be appointed to bring the same to a successful issue and failing this to devise some profitable disposal. The following were appointed a committee Prof. Theo. Ross, chairman, A. E. Dewar and John Newson. The following resolutions were also passed.

1. Resolved that the thanks of the Association be tendered the Provincial Exhibition Association for the use of their plates to show the exhibits on. 2. Resolved that the thanks of the Association be tendered the press for valuable assistance in reporting the present sessions and for articles written now and then on Horticulture. 3. Resolved that the Association place on record its appreciation of the services of Mr. A. E. Banks on Horticulture, also for the services of Prof. Macoun and H. G. Vroom in the present meeting. 4. Resolved that the Association place on record its appreciation of the bulletins issued by the Fruit Division at Ottawa and pray that they may enlarge and issue them more frequently. 5. Resolved that the Association urge upon the Federal Department the necessity of providing a capable and instructive man to teach the farmers how to make a success of Horticulture. 6. Resolved that the thanks of the Association be tendered the local and federal governments for valuable assistance rendered. The following officers were then elected for the ensuing year. Pres.—A. E. Dewar. Vice Pres.—D. J. Stewart. Prince County Directors were re-elected. Queens County Directors, J. Johnston, J. Newson and A. K. Henry. Kings County Directors, J. Robertson, A. J. Annear and Mr. Boyver. Auditors, re-elected.

FURTHER NEWS OF NEWFOUNDLAND WRECK

HALIFAX, Dec. 8.—A large quantity of ship's fittings have been found on the west coast of Newfoundland. The wreckage consists of several suits of oil-clothes and a number of life-belts. The articles were found ten miles north of where the wreck of the steamer Soo City occurred. On the belts was the name "Stanley" and from appearance it would seem that they had been in the water several days. At first it was feared that a wrecking steamer of that name, which had operated on the Newfoundland coast, had been lost, but this craft left the Ancient Colony several months ago. Inquiry fails to elicit information about any such steamer being overdue or sailing from any port.
