Now, however, the Postmaster has arranged for the vending of stamps at the different points in the city so that they will be convenient to all sections. Permits are being issued by the Department to the following merchants: James P. Duffy, Lower Queen Street; Carter & Co., Queen Square; Thomas F. White, Grafton Street; R. W. Tomlins, Euston Street; Percy L. Smallwood, Upper Queen Street; Sidney Grey, Railway Depot. It is not lawful for any person to exercise the business of selling postage stamps unless duly licensed so to do by the Postmaster General, and under such conditions as he may prescribe.

BIG DEMAND FOR PELTS.—Dr. Leo Frank yesterday received word from New York that there is a very big demand for silver black fox skins of the second and third grades. He is advised that the New York market could take up this year as many as five thousand pelts if the Island can produce them, and that under the circumstances the advice is to kill all foxes that are undesirable in a ranch and have them ready so that they may be sold at either the New York or St. Louis sales. This means that the pelts must reach those cities by at least the eighth of January. It is advised that ranchers ship the pelts to the Fur Sales Board in Charlottetown as they have the best facilities to market same and are getting prices that are very satisfactory. Great praise and credit is due Mr. Chester McLure, who is practically the head of the Fur Sales Board and is giving his entire time and attention to the fur industry of this Island and deserves every encouragement from the Island ranchers.

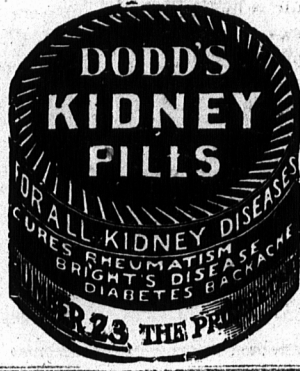
