Jap stories of Assassination Believed untrue

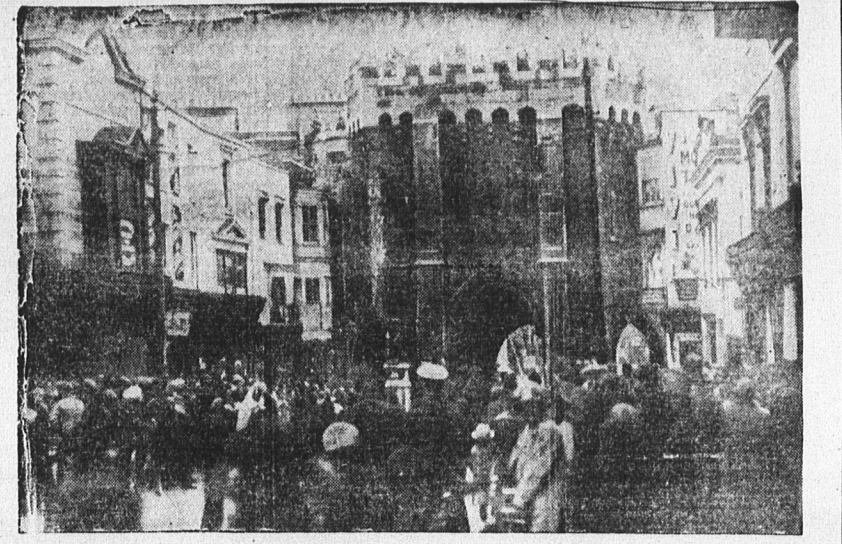

Striving to solve the problem of shipping on which Great Britain is so dependent, the British Admiralty today announced that the loss of shipping in the Atlantic at a rate officially described as grave, although at least less than in the German unrestricted campaign against shipping reached its height.

New Destroyer Deal Said Near; Big British Need

Commons Hears Suggestion Appeal be made for American Warships to Guard Convoys and for Financial Help.

LONDON, Dec. 4.—(CP)—The Daily Mail today in one dispatch under a Washington dateline, said tonight:

The United States government are placing 150 American merchant ships at Britain's disposal immediately.

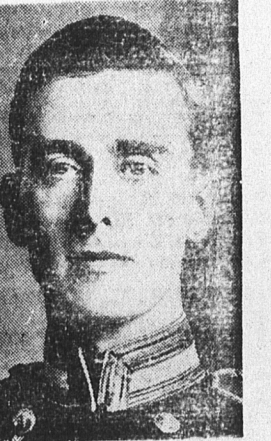
The dispatch attributed to unnamed sources "of the highest repute," said: "This timely aid, decided on in government conferences in the past 48 hours, is part of a plan to mobilize all available American merchant shipping to meet what officials here (in Washington) believe is Britain's first and most imperative need for supplies."

It added: "More destroyers are likely to follow, as well as an increased flow of aircraft," and that it was understood that President Roosevelt "had down broad approval for this increased extensive aid to Britain before sailing on his Caribbean cruise."

LONDON, Dec. 4.—(CP)—The House of Commons heard an unofficial suggestion today that the government appeal to the United States for warships to guard Atlantic convoys and for United States dollar credits to pay for supplies.

Mr. Campbell Hannah, Conservative, urged in the question period that the United States "help patrol trade routes of the Atlantic with her own navy." Moreover, he said, Britain should tell Washington candidly: "We want financial help."

Government spokesmen avoided a direct reply to Mr. Hannah, who reflected the national concern over U.S. aid.
