SAVING BANK INTEREST.

There is an old saying, "If you would know the value of money, go and try to borrow some." This has been exemplified during the past few months when there seemed not to be money enough to go around.

The plain people having money to lend would apparently in most instances rather leave it with the Government or the chartered banks where the security is the best possible, than to loan it to private creditors at double, or two and a half times the rate interest which the savings banks would give.

But the people who can only get three per cent from the Government or the banks for their savings are led to wonder why the Government cannot pay them at least four per cent when it is compelled to pay five or six in London.

The first drop of the mercury to zero sent the winter steamers away. The Tunnel would stand the cold better than that, and it would not be perpetually changing its route.

One of the principal reasons why Georgia adopted prohibition was because the licensed liquor dealers shipped liquor from the "wet" counties into the "dry" counties and thus made local option ineffective.
