INSTANTLY KILLED.—

Mr. Ralph Ching, 31 years of age, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Ching, of Summerside, was instantly killed in a train wreck which occurred on Tuesday between Portsmouth and Concord on the line of the Boston and Maine Railway. The news was received by Mr. Ching in Summerside on Wednesday morning and was later confirmed in a telegram from the manager of the Boston and Maine system at Boston. The news of the fatality made a deep impression upon the hundred friends and former comrades of Ralph Ching when the information was circulated. He visited his home in Summerside last about two years ago. For the last six years he has been employed by the Boston and Maine system and at the time of his death was engineer on one of the passenger trains running between Portsmouth and Concord N. H. Besides his parents a brother and a sister in Summerside, a widow, residing in Manchester, N. H., are left to mourn.

But has He not wept His own?

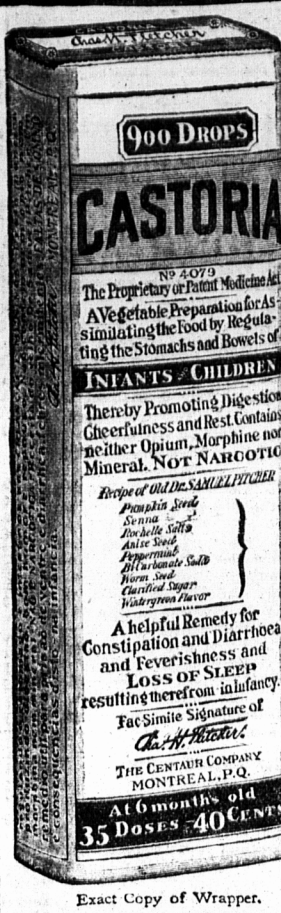
And from them there comes a brightness
