The History of a Methodist Circuit in Prince Edward Island

Tracing its Roots in the Cultural, Educational and Commercial Fields of the Community.

CHAPTER SIX (Continued)

Rev. G. O. Huestis who succeeded Mr. Buckley in 1862 made Summerside a daughter church to Bedeque by holding the first regular preaching services in the school house later known as the "old Western School."

vival during Mr. Huestis' pastorate added to the church in many of the preaching appointments.

The little church at Cape Traverse was of slow growth, hardly keeping step with the community which had its chief fame as the island terminal of the winter ice-boat service.

The old church near the shore in North Bedeque, like its Methodist contemporary, was replaced by a new one nearer the main highway. Occupying glebe land reserved by the government for church purposes, there is no record of its erection though it was probably built in the decade of 1830-40.

Bedeque Presbyterians continued under the effectual preaching of Rev. Robert S. Patterson who combined the oversight of his flock with school-teaching and farming.

The old church near the shore in North Bedeque, like its Methodist contemporary, was replaced by a new one nearer the main highway. Occupying glebe land reserved by the government for church purposes, there is no record of its erection though it was probably built in the decade of 1830-40.

The second church which stood just a little north-west of the third and present church had a session room at the back. The main edifice, plastered in square-box style had four gothic windows on each side as the only decorative touches in an uncompromising plain interior.

In 1862 Bedeque Presbyterians Church had the attention of the lawmakers at Charlottetown for a short time when the minister, Rev. R. S. Patterson (ex officio) and Hugh Montgomery, Esq., Hon. Alexander Anderson, Robert Cairns, Thomas Townshend, John Clay, and their successors were made a "body corporate" under the style and title of "Minister and Trustees of the Presbyterian Church, Bedeque."

In North Bedeque the Presbyterians stood to pray and sat for the lining and singing of the metrical psalms as led by the preacher. Across the Dunk the Methodists in Centreville stood to sing the lively tunes and hymns in Wesley's Book.

Other customs which a hundred years would bring to a uniformity, though not necessarily an improvement, in either case, included the dispensation and reception of the sacraments.

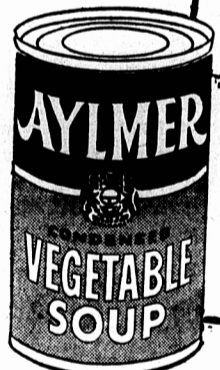

Presbyterian calendar which strenuously excluded all holy days or religious anniversaries. Preceded by preparatory services for two days, the faithful gathered on Sunday, outdoors if it were fine, around an actual table spread for the Lord.

Methodist preparation for the Quarterly Communion was a matter of right living, right thinking and right believing. If a member of the Society had walked aright, with love towards his fellow-men, attending regularly upon preaching-services and class-meetings, he received a quarterly ticket, with his name on it, signed by the pastor, admitting him to Communion.

The Baptists too, at this period, stood for prayer and it was not till the latter third of the century that the congregation needed to be reminded that standing or kneeling was the suitable posture for prayer. By 1842 the Baptist Church of Bedeque had grown sufficiently for Tryon to separate, and in 1859 the Bedeque Baptists were incorporated by an act of the General Assembly.

Rev. Malcolm Ross was Baptist pastor at this time, serving a church where the ministers changed less frequently than the Methodists. The first settled pastor who came in 1833 was Rev. Charles Tupper, father of the famous son of the same name.
