John Alexander Dowie, the organizer and promoter of Zionism is undoubtedly a remarkable man, with something of the organizing power of General Booth, but more questionable in his methods. He has founded and created a city of 10,000 people which is a hive of industry and reported to be rapidly growing. Not satisfied with this he has organized a plan to invade New York, putting 3,000 persons at work in the propagation of his scheme. Every member of the force has been specially drilled for his work, and has been photographed and will carry a special identification card bearing his photograph while, a similar card will be on file at the New York headquarters. Rooms for all have been engaged in the city, and meals will be served to all at Madison Square Garden. Meal tickets can be obtained in advance at \$5 for thirty or more meals. They will be provided with special knapsacks for carrying literature when they are engaged in house-to-house work. All must keep diaries of their daily and hourly doings, which will be examined and checked up when they return, this in order to make sure that they have not devoted Zion's time to personal interests. All these will work under military discipline to further the Zionist movement in New York, and after New York is captured there is a world-wide scheme to follow. Dowie's work is calculated to set the churches thinking of what may be accomplished by organization with a masterful spirit at the head.

A general election is pending in Cape Colony and the Progressives under Dr. Jamieson have issued a program. The first clause is a promise of support to all movements for uniting the Mother Country with the Colonies. Next to this in importance for the Empire comes the clause declaring the opposition of the party to imported Asiatic labor and demanding the exclusion of Asiatics al-

together. The other points in the program are mainly of local interest only—such as the extension of railways, irrigation, and the industrial education of natives. Great stress is laid upon the compulsory, free education of the white population, and a liquor law absolutely prohibiting the sale of intoxicants to colored natives.

We venture the opinion that Hon. George E. Foster will shine conspicuously and do honor to Canada in the fiscal campaign in England, whither he goes to assist Mr. Chamberlain. Mr. Foster is an exceedingly able and lucid advocate of any cause which he espouses, and is not likely to meet any one who can speak more convincingly on Canadian tariff experiences than himself.

The St. John Sun prints an Ottawa despatch which intimates that friends of Hon. A. G. Blair are very desirous for his restoration to a cabinet position. "It is also rumored," the despatch goes on, "that the Premier has given his consent to the return of Mr. Blair provided his New Brunswick colleagues would sign a round robin asking for it." It is added that several prominent Liberals declared the rumor untrue. It certainly reads like a very improbable story.

Woman suffrage for federal purposes was some time since granted in Australia and in the general elections which are to come on in December there will not only be women voters but some women candidates as well. The feminine candidate is, however, rather discouraged by the Australian, as she has been by the New Zealand press. It is thought the women had better wait to gain some experience in political affairs as voters before claiming their right to sit in Parliament. There are 800,000 women eligible to vote in the Australian Commonwealth.

It turns out that the right of way for the Grand Trunk Pacific through the crown lands of New Brunswick, Quebec and Ontario has not yet been secured, and this may not be so easy of settlement as some have supposed.
