FIRST ATLANTIC CABLE SAVED BRITAIN \$300,000. IN MOVEMENT OF TROOPS

Early in the cable business its value was strikingly emphasized. The first trans-Atlantic cable, which was laid in 1858, lasted only a few weeks but during that time the British government is estimated to have saved some \$300,000 by using it to change the sailing orders of some troops then stationed in Canada, according to the Canadian National Telegraphs. Since that time the submarine cable has been extended all over the world.
