I. O. O. F. CHOOSE MAPLE LEAF

MONTREAL, Que., May 30.—The choice of the Maple Leaf by the Daughters of the Empire is noted in the Gazette's remembrance column under date of 1905. Mrs. J. P. Mullerky read a paper on which she remarked on the happy selection of this emblem.

It was held in high esteem by the earliest settlers. In 1604 a number of Le Canadiens had an article from which it would appear that Canadians had chosen the Maple leaf as an emblem. At the first meeting of the St. Jean Baptiste Society in Montreal in 1834 it was proposed to adopt the Maple Leaf as an emblem. The Hon. D. E. Viger explained its suitability for Canada. The tree, at first young and fragile, takes nourishment from the soil and becomes strong, bearing storms and triumphing over difficulties, he said. In 1860, on the occasion of the visit of the Prince of Wales, the Maple Leaf was formally adopted as an emblem. In 1867, at Confederation, the Maple Leaf was retained.

CROWN GUARDS THE CHILD

(By The Canadian Press)

TORONTO, Ont., May 30.—"In the children's court, it is a case of the crown for the individual, and not against, as in criminal courts," said Judge Mott when he was addressing the York Pioneers. "The child is not viewed as an offender, but as needing assistance and help, and thus the juvenile court is purely an adjustment."

It was necessary, in order to make such adjustments, to find the cause for any delinquency, continued Judge Mott. There was a clinic in the juvenile court, he explained, with

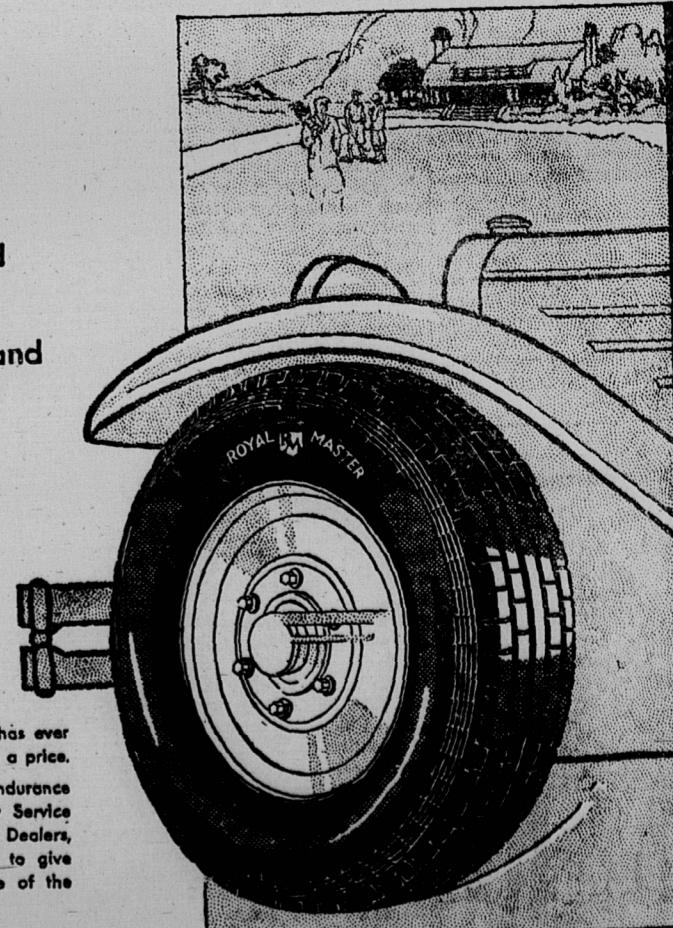
