to consult his government. From the start he had insisted that Chile's special geographical situation affected her position.

A four-point statement was thrashed out in a series of talks among the conference leaders, the climax being a session in the office of Foreign Minister Oswaldo Aranha of Brazil, at which adherence of the two reluctant powers finally was won.

Besides Aranha and Rossetti, those attending were the United States undersecretary of state, Sidney Blackmer, Tom Kennedy, Oscar O'Shea and Charles Wilson. Sam White directed from a script by Lambert Hillyer and Joseph Hoffman.

The first two points of the formula reiterate the longstanding declarations that any act of aggression against an American republic by a non-American state is an act of aggression against all of them and that all 21 nations will cooperate for their mutual protection.

The third and fourth points, embodying the question which has occasioned all the negotiations with Argentina and Chile, are: "The American republics consequently declare that in the exercise of their sovereignty and in accordance with their constitutional institutions and powers, provided that these are in accord, they cannot entertain diplomatic relations with Japan, Germany, and Italy, since Japan has attacked and the others have declared

RETIRED RAILWAYMAN DIES

PREDICTS TOURIST INCREASE

Mr. Frank H. Dunn, General Travel Representative of the Montreal Daily Star, Standard and Herald, left this morning on return to Montreal after spending two days in the city. He predicted increased tourist trade for Prince Edward Island during the coming summer according to the many inquiries received at the three travel offices in Montreal. WAR UPON A COUNTRY OF OUR HEMISPHERE

The American republics finally declare that before they reestablish relations referred to in the previous paragraph, they will consult together in order that their decision may be collective and unanimous.

Despite the Chilean reservation and the careful wording of the third article, backers of the diplomatic rupture were elated. A United States observer commented that the conference already could be called a success, even though it has four working days remaining.

The agreement still requires the approval of the foreign minister or chief delegates of 16 other American republics, assembled at this third consultative Pan-American conference.
