the United States objecting to the draft regulations submitted by Canada. The Laurier government, however, was disposed to favor the waiving of the mixed tribunal and trust to direct conference.

Mr. Haysen goes to Washington in connection with this affair, his visit following upon a voluminous correspondence upon the subject.

The present trip of the minister of marine and fisheries, indicates that the Canadian and United States governments have at last come close enough to a definite understanding in regard to the proposed regulations to warrant a personal interview between representatives of the two countries. At this interview, or at perhaps a series of interviews which will take place next week in Washington, it is expected that a final and satisfactory arrangement will be made. Draft regulations as suggested by the Canadian government and by the United States government have been exchanged through Right Hon. James Bryce, British ambassador at Washington, and the governments have arrived at something like common ground. During his stay in the United States capital, the minister of marine and fisheries will likely go over with the ambassador such international fishery matters as still remain outstanding.

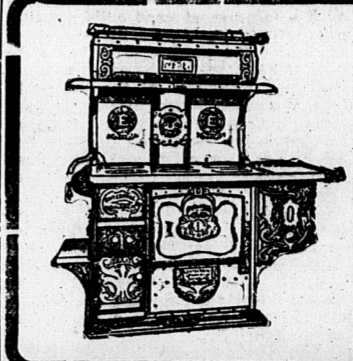
