Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at the Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. (1) Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. (2) In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.50 per acre. (3) Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. (4) A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.50 per acre. (5) Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

THE SONS OF THE CLERGY AT THE WAR.

Canon Simpson, of St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, preaching on Oct. 1st, referred to the share the sons of the clergy were taking in the war as follows:— And the honor of the Church in the war is not left to the laity. The sons of the clergy are doing their share. It is a common jest that the sons of the clergy are, as a rule, not of much account.

The English Church papers publish each week a Roll of Honor of the sons of the clergy who have fallen in the war. From fifteen to thirty names appear in each issue. The week after the Jutland Battle there were fifty-three names. At least nineteen of our Bishops have lost sons and if all these are noted, think of the thousands serving who have so far escaped the supreme sacrifice.

After the noble way the aristocracy of England responded to the nation's call, Lloyd George, the most democratic of Welshmen said he would never again declaim about "wicked dukes." It would be well if others would follow his example and no longer speak sneeringly of the sons of the clergy.

Canon Simpson afterwards received news that his own boy, Oct. 1st, perhaps while he was speaking.— Church Work.

THE POWER OF THE PENNY.

Gov. Emanuel L. Phillip, of Wisconsin, a hundred of the most widely known educators, medical men, nurses, social workers, have turned "movie" actors. City schools, country boards of education, hospitals, all have been used as scenery, with real professional actors as the leading people in the presentation of the "movie" route of the greatest educational project in the history of America's war against disease. "The Power of the Penny" is a play, written by one of their own workers, the association and the university have arranged to have it presented in nearly one thousand show places. Of these four hundred are social centres and institutions conducted by the state university extension division. The other six hundred are state picture theatres which will give their patrons this inoculation of health hunting as part of the paid in programme.

Three Milwaukee theatres, the biggest "movie" houses in the state, will do something never before done—present the duplicate films simultaneously. And this all worked out for Wisconsin, where every person on the film is known personally in some locality.

The Milwaukee movie houses are even planning a great step to aid the war against disease, for they propose to hold dances in the forenoon for school children, to see the film only at half price, and turn the entire receipts over to the anti-tuberculosis association.

A score of physicians of the state club women, nurses, social workers, sagittorium, superintendents, state, county and city officials and hundreds of school children will present in the film play actual scenes enacted by the people who are engaged in them in real life. The play is "The Power of the Penny."
