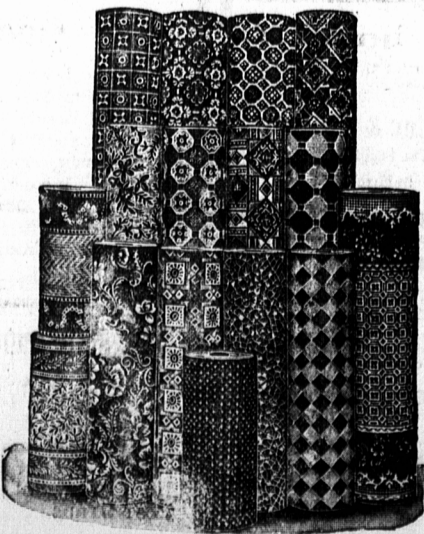

EDITOR'S MAIL.

THE ROW ON ST. JOHN RIVER.

Sir:—Knowing your interests in and your knowledge of New Brunswick affairs, I am quite sure that you will pardon any suggestion of mine that you give an adequate account of the present trouble on the St. John River, or, rather, let me say, the state of Maine, I enclose you a clipping from Saturday's Halifax Herald which is absolutely misleading in its heading. The Canadian and American crews are not clashing at the locks, but two rival American crews are.

First, then, the St. John Lumber Company, so called, is an American company with large mills at Van-Buren, Maine. They cut logs on the Allegash River, a southern tributary of the St. John, which Allegash is altogether in American territory. At its head, are large lakes, about on the same level as the head-waters of the Penobscot. Now, Marsh & Ayer of the Penobscot River, have really dammed up lakes and taken water their way which should come to the Allegash and then to the St. John River. And the firm, which is bringing them to task, is not a Canadian firm at all, but an American company who want to get their logs to their mill at Van-Buren. Now, it is quite true that the natural flow of the lakes mentioned, Churchill and Chamberlain is by the Allegash and St. John, and New Brunswick may have an interest in the question of the small consequent lowering of the main St. John caused by Marsh & Ayer's action. But at present, no Canadian is in the row. Second: May I also add that in May last when such a rare head-line were printed about a squabble at Van-Buren, it was not an international question. Levi Pond, who then dynamited a boom at Van-Buren, drives all the logs on the main St. John, which come to the large city mills to be sawed. Two thirds or perhaps three fourths of these are American logs, cut in Maine. Mr. Pond, therefore, is almost entirely in the employ of those who cut and saw American lumber. He had a clash with the St. John Lumber Company of Van Buren, Maine, as to getting by their booms at Van Buren. This was all, Pond an American, on one side, against an American firm. True, Mr. Pond went to Fredericton etc, but I believe Premier Tweedie was too wise to be caught by an astute American who was trying to get Canada to take up his private row. And anybody who knows Levi Pond knows that with him in this matter it is Levi Pond first.

I think these facts should be published all over the Maritime Provinces. I have them at first hand, having been in the vicinity for a month this summer, and having talked with lumbermen on both sides of the river, and also, with the driving boss of the St. John Lumber company of Van Buren.

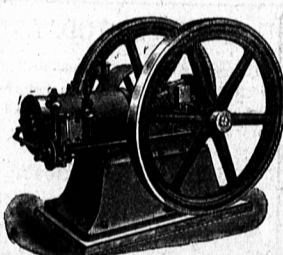
