Only a few days ago a letter was received here addressed to "Mr. Buffalo Bill, care Union Pacific Depot, Cheyenne, Wyo."

The missive was postmarked Dixon, Ill., and on the reverse side of the envelope was a return address which said, "Return in five days to The Dixon State Hospital."

The address was written in pencil and was scrawled.

The letter was turned over to postal authorities by Norman A. Miller, Union Pacific agent here.

PROHIBITION CASES—In the Summerside Police Court on Tuesday, two prohibition cases came before Stipendiary Magistrate E. H. Strong, K. C. The first case was that of the young man, who walked out of the court room while his case was in progress and made his escape to the mainland. He is a native of Bathurst but had been living in Summerside for some time. He was arrested last week in Newcastle, N. B. and brought back to stand trial. He was charged under the Customs Act for having dutiable goods in his possession and was found guilty and fined \$50 and costs or one month in jail. He was also charged under the Prohibition Act for having liquor in his possession and was fined \$200 and costs or 3 months in jail. Another case against a Summerside party for selling liquor contrary to the Prohibition Act was convicted and fined \$200 and costs or three months in jail. A Summerside party pleaded guilty to having partridges in his possession contrary to the Game Laws and was fined ten dollars and costs. These cases were brought by the Mounted Police. Mr. W. Henry Noonan and Mr. L. G. Lewis defended.—S

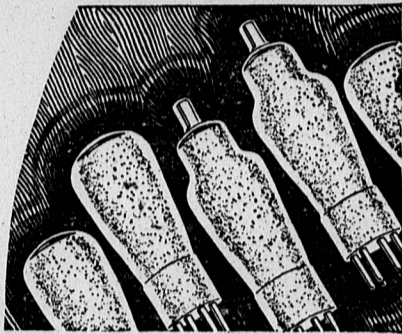

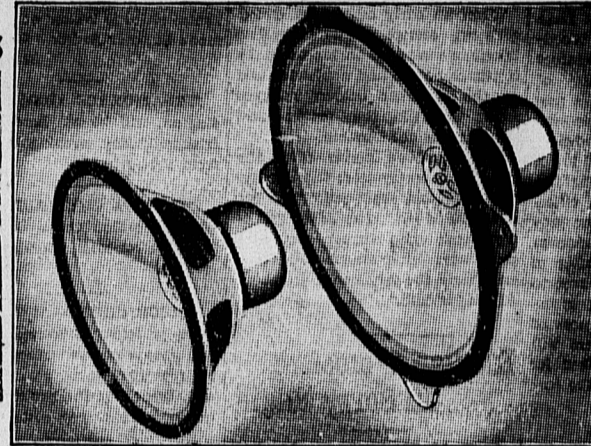
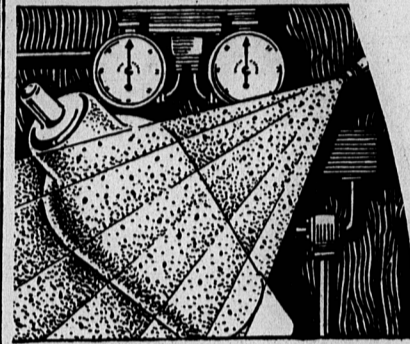

THINKS OTTAWANS NAMED MICHIGAN

HARBOR SPRINGS, Mich., Oct. 19—A new theory that the name of the state of Michigan is of Ottawa
