The latest news, first of all.

The S. S. Harland leaves this port for Orwell today at 2 p. m. returning to the City tomorrow morning and leaving here again on return at 3 p. m. same day.

The marriage of George T. Mahon, son of the late E. T. Mahon, to Miss Helen Blanchard, of Charlottetown, will take place April 27th. The wedding took place in London, Eng.—Hallfax Recorder.

On April 13th the Pownal Auxiliary of the W. M. S. held its regular monthly meeting at the home of Daniel and Mrs. Wood, Hazelbrook, where a very pleasant afternoon was spent. The auxiliary had the pleasure of adding another life member to its list namely Mrs. John R. Drake, Pownal, making two for the year.

A very enjoyable evening was spent on the 14th when a social game of ball was played by the young people of Hazelbrook and Pownal, after which they proceeded to Moore's restaurant for refreshments.
