

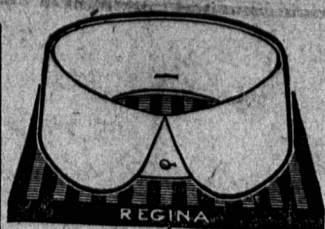

No other organization, however, seems to fill the place which the Women's Institute occupies in the lives of its members.
