Notice Re-constructing Drains on Public Highways

The attention of the public is called to Section 85 of the Road Act which reads as follows: "No person shall obstruct or impede the water course of any drain draining any highway in order to facilitate his access from his property to such highway, and it shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of land fronting on the highway to see that such drains are kept open at the point of approach through any gateway, lane or other way from the property owned or occupied by him to such highway, and any offence against this provision shall be punishable by fine not exceeding ten dollars."

MONCTON, Dec. 20.—The Roman Catholic church of Buctouche, Kent County, was today destroyed by fire this afternoon, entailing a property loss to the congregation of \$200,000. It was a wooden structure, accommodating about four thousand people and was built at a cost of about \$60,000 to replace a church burned about thirty years ago.
